## Quilt Sleeves

- Cut 8<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" wide fabric strips, WOF. Cut the number of strips you will need to go the width of the quilt: 1 strip - up to 40" wide, 2 strips up to 80" wide, etc. This is based on the width of your strip fabric. I sometime use 108" wide muslin to make sleeve.
- 2. Connect strips on short ends to make the length desired.
- 3. With right sides together stitch a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam the length of the fabric. Turn fabric to right sides. When I use a serger I don't turn the sleeve.
- 4. Stitch a line of basting about 1/2" from one of the edges. I prefer to stitch the line of basting opposite the seam.
- 5. Iron the sleeve with seam running down the center of the sleeve.
- 6. Place the top of sleeve just below the bottom of the quilt's binding and stitch down with running stitch. Stitch down the bottom of the sleeve with a running stitch. Remember not to stitch al the way through the quilt.
- 7. The tuck (made by the running basting stitch) should be running down the center of the sleeve after applying to the back of the quilt. Remove basting stitch and *VOLA*! You've just put a sleeve on your quilt!
