<u>Challenge</u> – We are including the Challenge rules again this month. Contact Donna Baker or Becky Covington if you have questions.

- 1. The overall size of your finished challenge piece must be a minimum of 9 inches square.
- 2. There is no limit to the maximum overall size of the finished piece.
- 3. The challenge piece may be made of at least one Booneslick star; however, there is no limit to the maximum number of Booneslick stars you may use.
- 4. The Booneslick star(s) may be anywhere within the piece and each star can be any size you choose.
- 5. There is no limit on color.
- 6. Any and all embellishments are OK beads, buttons, feathers, thread painting, paper piecing, painting, any technique.
- 7. Be creative.
- 8. You may enter as many times as you wish.
- 9. Must put a 4 inch sleeve on the back at the top.
- 10. Must include a label.

Keep up the good work and thanks so much for all you are doing.....it's going to be another great BTQG quilt show!!





Due to a limited amount of parking at Bonnie's home, please meet at 8:30 am at the East end of Home Depot on Clark Lane to car pool.

If you like to create your own fabric or embellish your work, or just learn a new technique this class is for you. This is a total hands on workshop. Here's your opportunity to learn about and play with high quality artist materials you can later purchase for yourself. Students will learn 9-10 different painting techniques and leave the class with painted samples in hand. Students will be provided with gloves a minimum of 2-10", 5-12", and 2-18" squares of prepared cotton blocks and a set of notes on the processes taught. All you need to do is wear old clothes and pack a bag lunch. Drinks and snacks are provided.
