February Rainbow House Workdays

Thursday, February 1, 6:30 pm - 9:30 pm

Monday, February 5, 8:30 am - 3:30 pm (Soup lunch)

In order to accomplish the most in the time we have at our workdays in February, the service committee will be putting together kits for the quilts to be made during December and January. Kits will include a pattern, fabric and batting. We'll be making both small and twin size quilts. We suggest you get a team (2-3 people) together to work on these kits so everyone will not have to bring all their equipment.

We have some fabric, but we will need more to get these kits ready so we are asking that <u>everyone bring fabric</u> to the <u>December meeting</u>. We'll need bright kiddie and teen fabrics and coordinating fabrics in the yardages shown below. Also, I know we're short of backing fabrics (1/1/2 yards will work for most of the smaller quilts, larger shown below).

All the patterns selected can be made with the following yardages:

Smaller quilts	Twin (basket weave)	<u>Twin</u> (hip to be square)
Theme print ½ yd	Theme print 2 yds	22 fat quarters
Fabric A ½ yd	Fabric A 2 yds	Inner border 1/3 yd
Fabric B ½ yd	Fabric B 2 yds	Outer border & binding 2 1/8 yds
Backing 1 ½ yd	Backing 4 yds	Backing 5 yds
Binding 3/8 yd	Binding ¾ yd	
Dandan 1 vid		

Border 1 yd

(Border can be same as theme print)

The book is THE HEALING QUILT, by Lauraine Snelling. Who among us has not been touched for the scourge of cancer. This is a novel of quilting friends who create a wonderful king-sized quilt to initiate fund raising to buy a new mammogram unit for their small community. In the process of working together on this quilt the ladies find they hold in common "quiet suffering triggered by painful circumstances: the death of children, the abandonment of husbands, the loneliness of depression." Through the process of completing this quilt and sharing their struggles these women find close friendship and renewal in their own spiritual lives. A great book to share with friends, but also don't forget to read it for your own enjoyment.

Our Guild has also received two copies of UNCOVERINGS 2006 from the American Quilt Study Group. This is an annual publication of Research Papers published by the American Quilt Study Group. The library contains 10 copies from past years and one of the 2006 copies will be added. The second book is available to anyone who wishes to purchase it. The price will be \$20.00. I will have the book available at the library table during regular Guild meetings.

Background and Family: I was born and raised in Utah. Met my sweet husband in Miami FL and have lived in Germany and all over the United States. I have one step-son in North Carolina, a son in Kansas City and a daughter here in Columbia. I have three grandchildren here in Columbia and that is why we retired here. I have a degree in Business Management and in Social Work. I have worked off and on in both fields, working most of my time with domestic violence perpetrators, retiring for good in 2001. That is not a beginners quilt, but I didn't know it at the time!!!) When we moved back to Utah in 1979 I met a new neighbor that belonged to a guild and I went with her. Before I knew it, I belonged to 5 guilds and soon became a guilt shop owner. When we moved to Tennessee in 2001, I sold my shop and spent my time meeting new quilters and learning new techniques. By far my favorite thing to do is needle turn appliqué and fabric dving.

Tell about your favorite project: I would say at the present my favorite project is what we are doing in "Stretching the Limits" Row by Row group. They are such incredibly talented women and I love seeing the creative juices that flow. I have learned so much by participating in the group.

What are some of your other interests: I enjoy the outdoors if the temperature is right, the humidity is low AND the bugs are not bothering me (ha ha). I spend lots of time doing things with my grandchildren and that probably brings me the greatest joy. We go to St. Louis one week a month to do a church assignment that is fulfilling. I also enjoy the time my husband and I spend exploring new places.


