As I was looking through the newsletter from the Heartland Network, I ran across the Profile of a Dedicated Quilter- I knew quilting was a big business but some things surprised me. This survey was done in 2003. I imagine the numbers have really increased since this survey was completed.

PROFILE OF A DEDICATED QUILTER (SURVEY)

1. These dedicated quilters represent 5.21% of all quilters, yet account for 94.7% of expenditures.

2. They are 99% female.

3. They are well-educated.(76% attended college)

4. Their average annual income is \$80,397.

5. They spend on the average- \$1,934 per year on quilting.

6. They have been quilting --an average of 12.3 years.

I don't know about you but three out of six matched me. I am dedicated but it doesn't have to do with money, years or how educated I am. It has to do with a lifelong love of quilts and people who enjoy the craft of quilting. To my quilting friends, I salute you.




Appletree Quilting & Viking Center Guild Appreciation Discount For BTQG Members
