February Rainbow House Workdays

Thursday, February 1, 6:30 pm - 9:30 pm

Monday, February 5, 8:30 am - 3:30 pm (Soup lunch)

In order to accomplish the most in the time we have at our workdays in February, the service committee will be putting together kits for the quilts to be made during December and January. Kits will include a pattern, fabric and batting. Anyone who wishes to help assemble the quilt kits for the February Rainbow House work days is welcome to come to the Library, January 12, 10-2, in Conference Room A. We'll be sorting and cutting fabrics so bring your rotary cutter, mat, and scissors. All willing hands are welcome. We'll be making both small and twin size quilts. We suggest you get a team (2-3 people) together to work on these kits so everyone will not have to bring all their equipment.

We have some fabric, but we will need more to get these kits ready so we are asking that **you bring fabric to the January meeting if you were unable to attend in December.** We'll need bright kiddie and teen fabrics and coordinating fabrics in the yardages shown below. Also, I know we're short of backing fabrics (1/1/2 yards will work for most of the smaller quilts, larger shown below).

All the patterns selected can be made with the following yardages:

<u>Smaller quilts</u> <u>Twin</u> (basket weave) <u>Twin</u> (hip to be square)

Theme print ½ yd Theme print 2 yds 22 fat quarters

Fabric A ½ yd Fabric A 2 yds Inner border 1/3 yd

Fabric B ½ yd Fabric B 2 yds Outer border & binding 2 1/8 yds

Backing 1 ½ yd Backing 4 yds Backing 5 yds

Binding 3/8 vd Binding 3/4 vd

Border 1 vd

(Border can be same as theme print)

- ♦ Approved the deposit of \$1000 to secure the Expo Center for 2008 guilt show.
- Approved purchasing metal quilt hanging rods from Morgan Frames.
- Approved having a fall workshop in the years between quilt shows.

Ouilt Entries Invited for Sawtooth Contest

PADUCAH, KY- The Museum of the American Quilter's Society invites quilt entries for the **2008 New Quilts from an Old Favorite: Sawtooth Contest**. Each year this international contest sponsored by Fair-field Processing Corp., Janome America, Inc. and Clover challenges quilt makers to create an innovative quilt based on a specific traditional pattern.

Entry form, fee and slides or digital images for the 2008 contest are due at the Museum by November 1, 2007; entry fee is \$40/\$10 Friends of MAQS. From the slide or digital image entries submitted, jurors will select 18 quilts for the exhibit and for award consideration. Quilts are selected on excellence in design and technique in addition to the quilt's contribution to an exhibit showing the wide range of designs the Sawtooth pattern can inspire. Selected finalists will be asked to send their quilts to MAQS by December 2, 2007, for judging. Cash awards are given to first through fifth places in the amounts of \$3,000, \$1,500, \$750, \$500 and \$300, respectively. All other finalists are awarded \$100 each. All 18 quilts will be on exhibit at MAQS in Spring 2008.

In conjunction with the American Quilter's Society, a catalog will be published, featuring each finalist and award-winning quilt in full color, with a photo of the maker and information about the quilt's development in addition to patterns and tips. Following the exhibit at MAQS, the quilts will travel through December 31, 2008. Quilters wishing to enter the 2008 contest can request an entry form by sending an SASE to MAQS, PO Box 1540, Paducah, KY 42002-1540 or visit the museum's website at www.quiltmuseum.org. Upcoming themes are Burgoyne Surrounded in 2009 and Sunflower in 2010.


