Two Jewels in our Guild Library

There are two books in our Guild Library which I want to call to your attention. These are not instructional books regarding how to quilt. However, both books contain inspiration and wisdom in our quilting world and within our quilting family. These are books I read rather casually, but now months after reading them I frequently think about their contents and find they have greatly influenced my outlook and enriched my quilting experience.

The first book is NO TIME ON MY HANDS by Grace Snyder. Grace Snyder wrote these words in her eightieth year with the assistance of her daughter, Nellie. Grace actually lived twenty years after their publication to the age of 100. Grace Snyder was born into a pioneer Nebraska family living in a sod house on the frontier in 1885. "As a child of seven and up," writes Grace, ".. I wished that I might grow up to make the most beautiful quilts in the world, to marry a cowboy, and to look down on top of a cloud. At the time I dreamed those dreams and wished those wishes, it seemed impossible that any of them could ever come true." But she saw all of these dreams realized. This book relates her early life in the sod house era, her married life on a ranch in Nebraska's sand hills and later flying above the clouds to exhibits where her quilts contribute to the worldwide revival of quilting.

Next is the book A COMMUNION OF THE SPIR-ITS: AFRICIAN-AMERICAN QUILTERS by Roland L. Freeman. Mr. Freeman is a photographer and folklorist who has spent 25 years documenting Black quilting practices throughout America. He has actually lived with quilts for all of his 60-plus years of life. Roland Freeman came by this love of quilts as a boy growing up in Baltimore in the 1940's when he was fascinated by a "healing quilt" that had been made by his great, great grandmother. "Quilts were special, even magical to me," he says. "They could heal and they could curse; they could capture history and affect the future; they could transform pain to celebration." Mr. Freeman sees quilts as objects of art, symbols of heritage and, of course, something to keep you warm."

I will provide more information and a supply list for you at the July meetings. They are really a lot of fun to make and not only cute, but great little purses. The only requirements are that we will ask you to make 2 and donate 1 to the boutique and you will need to purchase a pattern. I will arrange to have to patterns available for you.

<u>Challenge</u>

Donna Baker and Becky Covington are coordinating the Booneslick Star Challenge for the quilt show. They thought it would be good to include a list of the rules again, so they are listed below. Please contact Donna or Becky for more information or with questions.

- 1. The overall size of your piece/wall hanging must be at least 9 inches square.
- 2. The overall size cannot be larger than 24 inches by 24 inches.
- 3. Your piece/wall hanging can be any shape other than a square but within the above size range.
- 4. The Booneslick Star(s) pattern can be anywhere on the piece/wall hanging and can be any size.
- 5. Must put a 4 inch sleeve at the top.
- 6. There is no limit on color.
- 7. Any and all embellishments are OK beads, buttons, feathers, thread painting, paper piecing, painting, any technique.
- 8. Be creative.
- 9. You may enter as many as you want.
- 10. Must include a label.
- 11. And remember.....demonstrations for constructing the Booneslick Star pattern are scheduled as follows:

Day Chapter - Ann Rennier will provide a demonstration for you from 12 noon-1:00 p.m. prior to the day chapter July and August meetings.

Evening Chapter – Bettina Havig will do a demonstration at 6:30 p.m. for the July evening chapter meeting and Suzanne will do one at 6:30 p.m. for the August evening meeting.

Background and Family Information: I grew up in Branson, MO when it was a quaint small town and "The Strip" was four blocks in Rockaway Beach. Anyone remember that? My husband and I met in Columbia while we were students in the late 50's. After trying to seek our fortune in Texas, we came home to Missouri. Dale's parents and grandparents farmed in the area so we came to Sturgeon "temporarily." And now I've lived here 45 years. Life certainly leads us to unexpected places. We raised three sons here. Dale retired in 1999 and died in 2003. My joys now are three grandchildren who live in Columbia.

How did you get interested in quilting: My mother was quilting in the 30's. A few we used but most were kept to treasure. There are some very interesting stories about this collection. She revived her interest in quilts in the 80's and pieced off and on until completing her last quilt top in 2005 at the age of 99. I started making a quilt or two just to let her know the heritage would continue. Little did I think it would lead to where quilting has taken me now!

Tell about your favorite project: Leaves - pieces, appliquéd, fused or glued are my favorite types of quilts. It's that love of the outdoors in my hillbilly soul.

Some other interests: My former title was "The Santa Gourd Lady." Dale grew gourds and did the dirty work and I painted them as Santas. This mushroomed into quite an enterprise and partnership. Now I paint a few each year and they are sold at Blue Stem in Columbia. Now the outdoors is where you usually find me. When my home was built in 1967, we started with two oak trees on the edge of an open field and now it is a forest. Quilting used to take second place and be done when it was either too hot or too cold outside. But lately it seems the draw of the sewing room and design

board is bringing me inside even on good days.

Background and Family Information: State Design Engineer for the Missouri Department of Transportation during the day, longarm quilter at night! I have a husband, two wonderful sons (one is 7 and will be in 2nd grade, the other is 22 and is a junior at the University of Missouri - Rolla in the aerospace engineering program). I also have 4 step-children, all old enough to be out of the house and on their own! I was raised in Joplin, Missouri and have lived in the Jefferson City area for 12 years. My parents still live in Joplin.

How did you get interested in quilting: My mother. I've been sewing my entire life but I did not try quilting until I moved to Jefferson City. My mother had tried for years to get me interested, but failed! My first attempt was a Quilt in a Day class taught at Nichols Career Center in JC. After that I was hooked!! It took about 3 years to complete.


