Tips and Tools May 2007 Janice Haralson

This year for the Starlight Piecemakers, I have endeavored to bring new items to the meetings. This month I gave information about how to pick up thread when the automatic thread cutter on your sewing machine cuts off the thread too short. I talked to several booths at the International Quilt Show in Chicago, IL. They gave me an idea that has helped.

The item is a magnifier tweezers combo from Hobbytools.com. The cost is \$2.00 for a stainless steel frame with a glass magnifier. You can order this off the internet or call 1-866-310-8650. The tweezers are really sharp pointed and they will reach down into the hole. The magnifier allows you to see what you are doing. Hope you will enjoy getting something that might work for you.

NAME: Judy Gieselman

CHAPTER: Day Chapter

MONTH: May

Background and Family: My husband Bob and I both grew up in Macon 60 miles north of here. We moved to Columbia in the early 60's and both worked at MFA Insurance (now Shelter). After a 9 month stint in Sedalia, MO in 1973 we returned to Columbia – Bob taking an American Family Insurance agency and I working in the Dean's Office of the MU College of Agriculture in International Agriculture Programs. My husband and I are both retired now.

How did you get interested in quilting: I've always liked sewing. My grandmother got me started as a child by giving me a small square of fabric to hem to keep me busy while she sewed. She always took me to the fabric store with her to help pick out fabric for my clothes. Several years ago while traveling to a craft festival with my traveling buddies we stopped at a fabric store in Lebanon, MO. I found the most beautiful little square of fabric called a "fat quarter." I still have that particular fat quarter along with many, many others!

Tell about your favorite project: I like what I am doing at the time. I'm working on a blue and yellow quilt now.

What are some of your other interests: I like gardening, both indoors and outdoors. I am a "windowsill" orchid grower. I have crocheted, tried knitting, and other crafts in the past. I've also done counted cross stitch for over 20 years. I also like to go antiquing.

Choice of a Friendship Block: In all my fabric collecting I've never bought 30s fabric – although I really like the beautiful 30s fabric quilts. So, I have chosen the fairy ring block using 30s fabric. I will have the packets ready for the July meeting.



NAME: Joan Westcott

CHAPTER: Starlight Piecemakers

MONTH: May

Background Info: When my name was drawn for the friendship star this month, I checked old newsletters to refreshed my memory. I was also selected for the friendship star in 2005. Since I submitted quite a lengthy contribution of my personal history for the August 2005 newsletter, I don't want to bore you with a repeat of that information. My interest in quilting projects has been expanding so I'll tell you a little about my current activities.

Tell About Your Favorite Project: I have three "favorite" projects I'm currently completing. The earliest project I've been at for about two years. It is the Prairie Flower A Year on the Plains pattern by Barbara Brackman. I am using the quilt-as-you-go method and will be finished as soon as I complete quilting my borders. The second project I've just started is the Quilting the Garden pattern by Barb Adams, Alma Allen and Ricki Creamer. Both of these patterns use large appliqué blocks with lots of flowers. My third project is the Moon in the Window by designer Elisa Wilson. I have a collection of Asian fabric which worked well with this pattern. I usually do my own hand quilting, but for this quilt of many circles I'm having it machine quilted using circle quilting over the entire surface. I'm excited to see the results.

By the way, the three books that contain these patterns are all available in our Guild library. We also have the templates for the Moon in the Window quilt for your use in the library.

Some Other Interests: I also attend two Guild interest groups. One is the evening appliqué group which meets the third Monday of each month at 6:30 the Boone Regional Library. The other group is the Redwork group which meets the fourth Thursday morning of the month. I enjoy both of these meetings. The special interest groups are a great way to make friends in the Guild.

Choice of a Friendship Block: I have not yet completed the quilt from my 2005 friendship drawing. The pattern I selected was Stars and Baskets from the Spring 2005 issue of McCall's "Vintage Quilts for Antique Quilt Lovers". Since I do not yet have enough blocks, I am planning to ask for a few more blocks to complete this quilt.




