Service Project Workday

The service project workday on February 5th was well attended in spite of the frigid weather. Those who were able to attend enjoyed great food, entertainment, productive sewing and socialization. Below is a recipe for one of the soups served compliments of one of our newest members Cindy Hitchcock.

Mexican Chicken and Barley Chili

1 cup chopped onion 1 clove minced garlic 1 Tbs oil 3 cups water 1/2 cup uncooked barley 1 16 oz can chopped tomatoes, undrained 1 16 oz can tomato sauce 1 14-1/2 oz can chicken broth 1 11 oz can corn, drained 1 4 oz can chopped green chilies 2 Tbs chili powder 1 tsp cumin 1 tsp ancho chili powder 3 cups chopped cooked chicken In a 4 quart pan, cook onion and garlic in oil until onion is tender. Add remaining ingredients except chicken. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat to low, cover and simmer 40 minutes, stirring occasionally. Add cooked chicken; continue to simmer 10 minutes until chicken is heated through and barley is tender. Add additional water if it gets too thick upon standing.

Note: That is what the recipe said. I just dumped all the ingredients into a crockpot about 7:00 am and brought it.

Makes 9 cups.


