DAYTIME FRIENDSHIP QUILT GROUP

Guidelines

1. The drawing for the monthly winner from the "pot" of active Friendship Quilt Group (FQG)

participants takes place during regular BTQG meetings. In the event the "pot" is not available, the drawing may take place at the Board meeting the following week.

2. BTQG members may become active participants by making at least one block within the BTQG year (July-June). A participant's name will be entered for each block completed. Members may choose to make blocks and not participate in the drawing. Their names will not be placed in the "pot".

3. The winner chooses the pattern, color, and fabric used in the blocks. The winner of the drawing should arrive at the next Guild meeting early to give out patterns or receive blocks.

Participants sign the record sheet, and make a block according to directions and return it to the winner at the next meeting. The winners shall keep an accurate list of blocks returned and shall give the list to chairperson by the meeting after blocks are due.

4. A previous winner becomes eligible to receive blocks after one calendar year. In July of each year the participant who has accumulated the most points will be awarded a quilt.

Participants who did not wish to participate in monthly drawing will be eligible for consideration in the July awarding of a quilt.

5. The friendship block program is separate from all other drawings.

NAME: Hsiao-Mei Wiedmeyer CHAPTER: Day Chapter MONTH: July

Background and Family Information: I was born in China, grew up in Taiwan but lived in Columbia since 1977. I worked as a project director of the Diabetes Diagnostic Laboratory at the University Medical School until I retired. My husband Ray was a farm boy from Wisconsin and we met at the University of Detroit where we both did our graduate work in Chemistry. We have been married for 35 years. We have a daughter who is a medical student at McGill University at Montreal, Canada and a son who is a business banker for Regions Bank in Columbia.

How did you get interested in quilting: I fell in love with American quilts almost as soon as I came to the USA. It is a form of art I have never seen before. Chinese also make quilts but the ones I have seen are mostly functional rather than artistic. I made six baby quilts by hand in 1978-79 when I stayed at home at the birth of my son but I didn't touch quilting again until I retired in 2003. I picked up where I left off 25 years ago and enjoying making quilts using all the newest equipment and techniques.

Tell about your favorite project: My optimal quilt project would be a personal flower garden. I want to plant a garden; take pictures of flowers from the garden; digitize, appliqué or embroidery the flowers into quilt blocks. All the skills I am learning now are preparing for this special "Hsiao-Mei's Garden" quilt.

What are some of your other interests: Both my husband and I love to travel. We have traveled to all seven continents in the world and over 50 countries (including Antarctica and Galapagos Island). When we are in Columbia, we enjoy biking and dancing.

Choice of a Friendship Block: The Indigo Kimono quilt was adapted from the book "Japanese Inspiration" by Janet Haigh. This design was traditionally used for a way to use old, worn kimonos to make new ones. I like its simple and elegant design and oriental flavors. I was very pleased to find sash fabrics that contain Chinese characters with red seals stamp all over. It ties well with the red and gold border. I hope everyone enjoys making it.


