**NAME: Kathy Ennis** 

**CHAPTER: Day Chapter** 

**MONTH: September** 

**Background and Family:** My husband, two sons (Troy & Kraig) and I moved to Columbia on November 1, 1975. We opened our appliance store on November 15th, which we still work at today. My third child Jessica was born here in 1978.

How did you get interested in quilting: I had always loved the old timey feeling that went along with quilts. The few quilts that are in my family were made from scraps, so that was my main introduction to quilts. Both my mom and gram did some stamped embroidery quilts also. In 1972 I decided to make a scrap quilt. I liked the feeling of using up what was on hand. At that time I was sewing all of my own cloths so I had many scraps of different types of fabrics so I used them all.. It's a wild looking thing, with many mistakes, but it is sentimental to me.

Tell about your favorite project: My first real quilting lessons came in 1978 at the quilt cottage. I took most all the classes offered and learned to hand piece, applique, and hand quilt, while making samplers, medallions, and wall hangings to name just a few. Time has become more limited now so I have been trying some machine piecing. I joined thimbleberries at Miss Millie's and am doing monthly blocks all by machine. At the end of this year, I will have put together 3 quilts, which is very exciting to me.

What are some of your other interests: My other interests include reading all kinds of books, knitting, crochet, cross stitch, needlepoint. I like working in the yard and with flowers but right now all I do is mow the grass. I'd rather spend what time I have on my sewing and crafting. This time of year I'm thinking of Christmas. I like making all kinds of ornaments from kits or patterns and maybe a few gifts also.

Choice of a Friendship Block: My block choice is for the Missouri "Home of the Brave " quilt project. Quilts made from these blocks are presented to families of fallen service men. I will provide fabrics and patterns.



**NAME: Sally Johnson** 

**CHAPTER: Starlight Piecemakers** 

**MONTH: September** 

Background and Family Information: I was born in Antigo. WI and have one brother and two sisters. My sister Shirley quilts. My parents each came from a family of thirteen children, and as you can guess, I have a lot of cousins. I spent a lot of my childhood in northern Wisconsin fishing and camping on the wonderful lakes. I enjoyed many vacations with my grandmother who taught me how to crochet. I also have three step sons, two grandchildren and two great grandchildren. All of my family lives in other states so I don't get to see them as often as I would like. After many years of working I went back to Milwaukee Area Technical College and got my certificates in Computer Programming and Business Mid-Management. I lived one year in Abingdon, VA, one year in Moberly and finally settled in Columbia where we have been living for the past 17 years. In July I retired from the University of Missouri and am looking forward to spending more time quilting.

How did you get interested in quilting: I worked with Connie Rice at TFE. One day she brought in some of her quilting and asked me if I would like to go to the next BTQG meeting, I said yes, and the rest is history. I have been quilting since 1994 and have finished a total of three full size quilts, the rest are wall hangings or UFO'S. One thing I have always enjoyed has been the workshops I have taken, which are invaluable for learning. The only quilts I can remember while growing up were those my mother made for our beds, nothing fancy.

Tell about your favorite project: I guess I would have to say a class I took from Sue Turnquist. The block came from the book "Strips that Sizzle" by Margaret Miller. There were literally hundreds of ways that the blocks could be combined to create a pieced quilt surface. It took me a long time arranging the blocks to achieve a three dimensional look. I had it in our 2000 quilt show. It was shades of black, grays, and purples.

What are some of your other interests: I inherited my love to paint and draw from my mother's side of the family. A lot of my mother's sisters painted, as well as my cousins. My favorite is oil paints but I have worked in all mediums including dyes. Another thing I like to do is design my own patterns, or do the illustrations for the ones I want to do again, but there were no detail pictures included with the pattern. I also like to take pictures. My favorites are flowers and wild life. One time I chased a butterfly for an hour until he landed on a flower. The time was well spent because the picture was beautiful.

**Choice of a Friendship Block:** I have chosen "Crossroads to Jericho". This 8" block will be going into the quilt I am making for my sister. I will cut and include the 1930 fabrics.



#### Tuesday October 3rd, 2006 - 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM Saint Andrew's Lutheran Church

This 4 hour class comes from the book "Square Dance" Fancy Quilts from Plain Squares by Martha Thompson. Twelve 4 ½" squares are pieced together, borders applied, then cut apart with a special template and re-sewn together again with another border. The finished size for this project is 14 ½" x 17", which is ideal for a mini quilt or place mat. It is not difficult to do, lots of fun, and great for beginners, as well as our experienced guilters. To save time the plastic tracing template guide will be provided. We will break for lunch, and a box lunch may be ordered.
