She will be presenting a lecture on Thursday September 28, two workshops on September 29 and a workshop on September 30. The first workshop will be a Kris Kringle wall quilt on Friday morning featuring quick-fuse appliqué techniques to make a charming holiday wall hanging. The Harmony wall quilt workshop on Friday afternoon features hollyhocks that are appliquéd and a simple pieced border. Nancy will discuss the various fusible products available for appliqué and threads for blanket stitching on raw-edge appliqué. The all day workshop on Saturday will be Vinnie's Double Pinwheel. This is a full size quilt also known by the names Whirligig and Double Pinwheel. Nancy will show you a step-by-step piecing technique to make this intriguing block a breeze. Don't miss this opportunity to get started on your holiday gifts or making that special project just for yourself. - ★ a motion that we discontinue the use of elevated platforms with guild members as quilt holders because of concerns with safety and liability

Background and Family Information: I grew up on a farm in central Illinois. Background and Family Information: I was born in Springfield, Ill, got an Animal Science degree from Ill. State, and did graduate work at the University of Wisconsin and MU. I have lived in Columbia for 26 years. 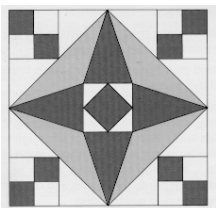

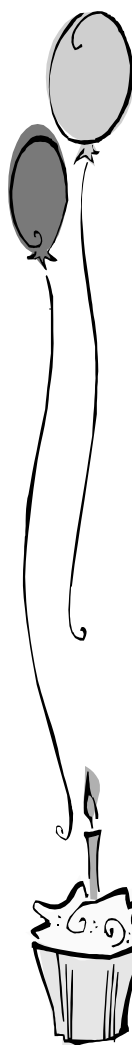

Featuring Nancy Odom - quilt designer, author, fabric designer and teacher

Nancy Odom has six books and over 30 patterns in publication. Also among her creations are the Quilter's Gloves for the machine quilter. Her company is **Timid Thimble Creations**. Nancy is also the co-author of *Elm Creek Quilts* and designed the fabric lines Azalea Trail and Gather Sunshine for P&B Textiles.

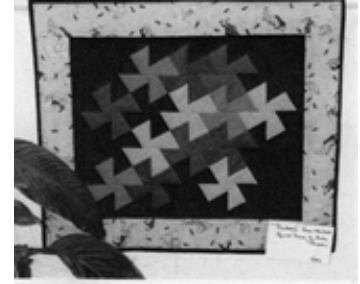
