August Programs

<u>Day Chapter</u> - Our August program will be presented by Juanita Yeager. Her lecture "Taking Traditional Flower Designs to Realism" will focus on her transition from the use of traditional flower block patterns to developing her own original style.

Juanita was born in Louisville, KY and lived most of her life there. Currently she lives in Columbia with her daughter and one grandson. Most days she can be found creating in her home studio. She travels mainly east of the Mississippi River to lecture, judge, curate and consult on quilt related events as well as teach creative quilt making and introductory art quilt making techniques.

Her work has been exhibited nationally since the mid 1980's in major judged and juried quilt shows as well as invitational exhibits. More recently her work has been exhibited in several international venues as well. She has been featured in several regional and national magazines and images of her work can be found in many publications by other quilt makers such as Margaret Miller and Joen Wolfrom. She sells her work from her studio and prefers to work on commission. Her work can be found in many private and public collections across America including the prestigious Museum of American Quilters Society (MASQ).

BTQG Presents Linda Jenkins

On September 6-8 Linda Jenkins from Piece O' Cake Designs will be presenting a lecture and two workshops for BTQG.

Originally from Tulsa, Oklahoma, Linda started her second career as a quilt designer after retiring from 20 years as a hair stylist and salon owner. Linda started quilting as a hobby in 1984. Her specialty is needle turn appliqué.

With her partner Becky Goldsmith they formed Piece O' Cake Designs, Inc. in 1994. Now they both travel and teach nationwide. Together they have published 21 books and 152 patterns. In 2002 they joined C&T Publishing. Their newest books are "Quilts with a Spin", "The New Appliqué Sampler", "Amish Inspired Quilts" and "Covered with Love." They also have a DVD entitled "Becky and Linda Teach You to Appliqué the Piece O' Cake Way." In addition they have designed nine collections of fabric for P&B Textiles.

Linda will be presenting a lecture on Thursday evening, September 6th on Coloring a Beautiful Quilt. The workshops will be on September 7 and September 8. The registration form is included in this newsletter and contains a description of the classes.

TIPS AND TRICKS BY Janice Haralson

I was challenged at the annual meeting to come up with ideas to use the mint holder given to each member who attended. I found that besides a pin holder, the openings on each side will act as a pin cushion if you put stuffing inside and use pins with bigger heads.

Another use would be to run different colors of pearl cotton or embroidery thread from the inside to outside by using a bigger eye needle. You can pull out what you would use for punch needle or hand embroidery work while keeping your thread neat, tidy and tangle free.

On another note, if you have not read Mark Lipinski's Quilter's Home magazine, I would urge you to purchase a copy as it contains great information. One article talks about the online site "YOUTUBE" where you can access quilting lessons, virtual quilt galleries, and sewing tips. You can log on at www.youtube.com and type "QUILT info" into the "search for" space at the top of the page. The articles and videos are short but very interesting. Just take a look.





A six-hour class for all skill levels you will learn to appliqué the Piece O' Cake way! You will learn easy template making, how to make and use a placement overlay and, most importantly, the invisible appliqué stitch. Linda will help each student perfect their invisible appliqué stitch while working on the following techniques: curves, inner and outer points, cutaway appliqué, reverse appliqué, circles, two-part leaves and more as time permits.

September 8 Workshop: "Lots of Leaves" - 9 am - 4 pm - \$40

A six-hour class for all skill levels you will learn the easy way to stitch all kinds of leaves. We'll work on a simple leaf, a two-part leaf, a leaf with reverse appliqué, a multi-part leaf and a curvy oak leaf. The block pattern designed for this class will be provided.
