Boone County Historical Society Exhibit

It's time to begin seriously thinking about our exhibition at the Boone County Historical Society. We are interested in Boone County quilts, Missouri quilts, and/or family quilts. If you own a quilt that you would like to share and want to have considered for the exhibition please send or give Bettina Havig a photo or slide, print or electronically, plus any information known about the quilt. In particular, we need the maker, date or approximate date (as you know it), where it was made, and pattern or family name for the quilt pattern. More information may be needed when the selections have been made. A committee will make the selections by May 1. Approximately 30-35 guilts will be hung. You must be willing to lend the quilt for the duration of the exhibit. The museum staff will install the exhibit May 12-14 and strike the exhibit at the end of June. You will be asked to sign a loan agreement.

In the spring of 1979 this brave little force made a commitment to host a national symposium in 1980 on the Stephens College campus.

The third and final book is entitled <u>The</u> <u>Quilt-A History and Celebration of an American</u> <u>Art Form</u>. Check out the Jan/Feb/2008 issue of "Fons and Porter's Love of Quilting" magazine at page 119 for information on <u>www.QNNtv.com</u>. For \$19.00/year or \$29.00/2 years you can have your own library of quilt videos at your fingertips. On your computer, you can watch what you like, when you like and as often as you like. At present they have a collection of over 1,000 programs.

The tool I want to preview this month is the <u>Zip</u> <u>Clip</u> binding tool by Martelli. This is a spring loaded tool with which you can attach clips which hold your binding tight while you are attaching it. The clips are easy to use, re-insertable into the tool and reusable time after time. The tool comes with eight clips and you can purchase additional clips if needed. This is a great little tool and Miss Millie's Quilt Shop has them for sale for \$9.95 plus tax. If you want further information, go to Martelli.com.

For February, we are looking for kits for wall hangings, pin cushions, pillows or anything else that you might have around your house. I know everyone has bought some kind of kit a while ago that hasn't been put together yet. I found two at my house without looking too far. You may put your kit together (preferred) or just donate the kit.

We also need painters so if you have any painting talent, we need your help. One project will be painted clay pots which can be used for candy dishes or fancy flower pots. I will have samples at the meetings. If you can't paint, please bring some small or medium sized clay pots for others to decorate. The other painting project will be snowmen made from fence posts, painted white with a painted snowman face. After painting, we will need little hats and scarves, knitted or fleece or made from Christmas fabric.

Carrol Lewis Introducing Terri Crane - January Starlight Friendship Block Winner "I moved to Columbia from northern California six years ago to be near my family. My daughter, Christine, lives in Columbia and my son, Mike, and grandson, Alex, are close by in Osage Beach. I work for an insurance company here in town and hope to retire soon. I made my first quilt in 1988 using six-inch squares (not blocks) - no pattern, no rotary cutter, no cutting mat, no design, no clue. I took the top to Stover Quilting to be quilted and didn't attempt another quilt until 1991 when my twin grandchildren were born. I took the leftover squares from the first quilt and cut them into small triangles, making two less-than-cribsize quilts - same M.O. as the first quilt. I bought my first pattern book in 1992, "Little Folks' Quilts from Big Folks' Patterns." I spent the next ten years making one or two baby quilts a year using patterns from that one book. I was a slow starter, but once I discovered fabrics and quilt clubs right here in Columbia, I haven't stopped "toolin' up". My recent projects include the Warmest Wishes Christmas appliquéd quilt classes at Appletree, Grandmother's Delight from a class at Circle of Friends in Osage Beach, and a simple batik kit and pattern I bought in Rochester, Minnesota, two years ago. My favorite project is whatever one I'm working on at the moment. When I'm not quilting, I love to travel. I enjoy reading a good mystery and baking cookies. I have not made a final decision on a block for my Friendship Quilt. I found one the other day, an early Kansas City Star pattern called "Contrary Husband." I thought that might be appropriate since I've had a few of those in my life. We'll see."
