TIPS, TOOLS & TRICKS

This tip is for quilters who need more light on their projects. At the Chicago quilt show, I found a product called the Bendable Bright Light. This light uses an adhesive, non-magnetic bracket which you attach to the side of your sewing machine. It has a flexible arm which then directs the light where you need it. It uses no counter space and puts white light directly on those hard to see places. It is great when you are sewing on dark fabrics or matching seams. It will give you 100,000 light hours, uses 120 volts, and is an energy efficient LED. The adhesive mount that holds the light on the side of the machine will not harm the machine electronics. No batteries are needed. It comes with an eight foot cord and brackets that you can fasten to the back of your machine so the cord is out of the way.

You can purchase this from: Dream World Inc., Bonners Ferry, ID 83805, phone # 866-64-2363 or from www.bendablebrightlight.com. The price is \$49.95. The cost of an additional machine bracket kit (so you can use the lamp on two machines) is \$9.95.

Another quilt tip on lighting: take along a light bulb with high wattage to put in lamps in motel or hotel rooms so you can see better for sewing.

Editor's Note: I also bought a Bendable Bright Light while in Chicago. It is worth it's weight in gold!!!




Appletree Quilting & Viking Center Guild Appreciation Discount For BTQG Members


