Bring a sack lunch or bring lunch in and enjoy the company of your quilting friends. There will be a business meeting followed by show and tell and a trunk show presented by our own Bettina Havig.

Also bring any quilts that you would like to hang in the Historical Museum display. The only requirements are that the quilts be more than 50 years old and come from one of the 50 states. The committee still needs more quilts, so please get yours out and bring them to either of the May chapter meetings.

Starlight Chapter—The program for the Starlight Piecemakers Chapter on May 1 will be a trunk show of family quilts presented by guild member, Linda Sappington and her mother, Fern Carter. Some of the quilts are from Linda's husband's family. Four generations of quilts will be included in the show. It is a wonderful chance to see the evolution of quilting in a family.

The Boone County Historical quilt exhibition will be installed the week of May 12. A few volunteers will be needed. The exact times are not yet determined but if you can help, please sign up at the May meetings.

REMINDER: If you plan to loan a quilt(s) please bring them to the May chapter meetings. If you can't attend either May meeting, please call me between May 1-8 to arrange delivery or pick up. **Any quilt, 50 years old or older from any state can be** exhibited.

I will collect the quilts and descriptions to be delivered to the museum. There is a loan agreement needed for each quilt. Copies will be available at the meetings. Please write up any information that you want included on the signage that will be used. Give the information, written out, to me at the meetings or email the information to me. Be sure that I know which quilt goes with which information. I will be taking a digital photo of each quilt to attach to the loan forms. Quilts need to have a sleeve attached. It will be a great help to me if I don't have to sew sleeves on to any quilts the day of installation. The sleeve must be sewn not pinned. It may be temporary and the fabric for the sleeve can be anything you have on hand. Bettina Havig

TIPS, TOOLS & TRICKS

Removing Pencil Marks

I have found the following tools to use in helping to remove pencil marks: <u>Fabric Eraser</u> (available everywhere but I would not recommend); <u>Fabric Eraser Pencil made by Clover</u> (did a really good job); <u>Fabric-Clean Electric Eraser made by Graphic Impressions</u> (requires 2 AAA batteries) (this erases quickly). Call 859-881-0377 to purchase one.

In "Tips for Quilters" by Rachel T. Pellman she says: "If all the pencil marks don't 'quilt away' during the quilting process, you can use three ounces of rubbing alcohol mixed with one ounce (two tablespoons) of water, and two to three drops of dishwashing liquid soap. (Be sure to test a small area for colorfastness first.) Hold an absorbent paper towel underneath the quilt, then gently brush the pencil lines with a very soft toothbrush with this mixture." Rachel says this recipe was shared with her by a group of fellow certified judges while attending a national quilt show many years ago.

<u>Washing Fat Quarters</u>: If you will clip the corners off your fat quarters before you wash them, they will wash and dry without ravels and tangles.

Buzz from a Quilting Bee

Our good friend Mary Louise died more than a year ago and left a tall stack of small flowers for about half of a Grandmother's Flower Garden quilt. She began this many years ago for her daughter.

Camille, Edie and I in our small weekly group, decided to take on this project. None of us had ever made a quilt from this pattern, never intended to, and really didn't care for it at all. I guess you can see where this is heading.

One of the frustrating parts was there are only a few ways the blocks will fit together unless you use a garden path. We didn't want to go that way since the pieces were already too small for our liking. (We had quite a few one way conversations with our departed friend telling her of our frustrations.)

After taking many stitches and taking OUT many stitches while experimenting, I was complaining to my daughter Susan and her husband that I was giving up LIKING quilting for Lent. Son-in-law Bob said, "Did you say you were giving up quilting for Lent?" I said "Oh, no, never that. We'll find a way." Now we know why our friend never finished the quilt.

A few weeks ago my daughter Jane came to the rescue. She used that pattern for her friendship quilt from the guild and loves to work with small pieces. As our fearless leader, she went online and found ideas for assembling this without a garden path and is showing us the way. With her help and that of daughters Carolyn and Colleen, we will see this daunting project through.

BTQG Fall Workshop—Mark Your Calendars!!!

Louisa L. Smith will be presenting a lecture and two-day workshop October 16-18, 2008. Louisa's work is the subject of two books "Strips 'n Curves, A New Spin on Strip Piecing" and "A New Twist on Strips 'n Curves." Her technique starts with colorful strip pieced fabric the "strata" and then takes off with a combination of straight lines and gentle curves to produce stunning designs of illusion and depth. Visit her website www.Quiltescapes.com or check out her book from the BTQG library to see samples of her work and get ideas for selecting the tools and fabrics you will need in her workshop. To start your collection of fabrics for the workshop keep in mind that you will need lots of fabrics in different textures and colors. You may use fat quarters or ¼ yd or 1/8 yd pieces. You will be cutting 1 1/2 inch strips and sewing them together. You will also need one yard of a background or focus fabric that will work with your other fabrics. So, start your collection now so you will be ready for the workshop "A New Twist on Strips 'n Curves" October 17-18.

MEET OUR WINNERS!!!

Mildred Hobson, one of our newer members, is the winner of the <u>Day Chapter</u> Friendship Block for March. This is Mildred's story:

I was born in Tecumseh, OK, the seventh child of twelve siblings. Both parents have Cherokee Indian bloodline (as well as German, Irish, Scottish, etc.!) so we moved a lot before they bought a farm in Lawrence County, near Miller, MO where I graduated from high school. That is also where I met my husband, Lewis, my senior year. He had graduated the year before in Fort Worth, Texas. It was love at first sight and we were engaged right away. He went into the Navy and I started to college in Springfield at Southwest Missouri State (as it was called then). Since my parents still had seven children at home, including two grandchildren they raised, I had to work and pay all my college expenses. So I took off and taught two years in a one room rural school--all eight grades. I attended SMS in the summers.

It was quite an experience as I was only 18 and 19 years old at the time. I worried that I was not wise enough and was damaging my students for life! But through the years when we would "go home" and run into them, they would greet me with hugs and say "You were my best teacher."

When Lewis returned from the Navy, we were married, and both graduated from SMS, Lewis with a degree in school administration and I a degree in Vocational Home Economics. We taught and worked in Missouri Schools for 35 years before retiring to our home on the Lake of the Ozarks in 1985. We had 20 years of happy retirement in our beautiful home on the lake-boating, swimming, fishing, in the summers and traveling in the winters. I lost Lewis in 2005 after 56 years of marriage, three children, seven grandchildren, and four great-grandchildren.

I learned to sew on my mother's Singer treadle sewing machine using printed feed sacks making gathered skirts and blouses that I wore to high school and college.

The first quilt blocks that I made were embroidered and my mother made them into a quilt for my oldest brother's wedding when he returned from WWII. While in high school, I made a Lone Star quilt top--no rotary cutters then! Later I learned this pattern is for an experienced quilter but it was my husband's favorite, mistakes and all.

Every time I make something, I cut the scraps or what is left, into 2.5 inch squares. So, my friendship block will be made using some of these squares.----

Thread Tip: Rehydrate thread with a spritz of water and then refrigerate it in a plastic bag.
