## November Programs

#### Day Chapter -

After our big 1980 National Quilt Symposium, BTQG started inviting outside speakers. One of the first outside workshop presenters was Cheryl Bradkin in July 1981. The workshop was on Seminole Patchwork. During that workshop, she introduced most of the group to rotary cutting. There were no rulers expressly made for rotary cutting so the group used 2" x 18" c-thru rulers. We've come a long way since then.

#### Hello Ladies,

The library is a "happening" place these days. We are having a great time selling the books you are donating to fellow quilters. Some people have even said after they have browsed through them they will bring them back and we can resell them. How about that for recycling! So many of you have stopped by to help the "new" librarian and I am having a great time getting to know you. Volunteering or being a part of an interest group is a wonderful way to get involved.

The library has purchased the BLOCK TOOL from Connie Chunn. It is a great tool that gives you all the facts you need to choose fabrics, cut, and assemble over 160 pieced vintage blocks from 4" to 12" in size. Also in the library this month is a novel "The Christmas Quilt" by Thomas J. Davis. It is a book of love, hope thru an account of a family in the mountains of North Georgia. After reading this book maybe it will inspire you to start working on some Christmas projects. A new book offered <u>next</u> month will be "Quilt Christmas Mantel Covers." Patterns include Gingerbread Men, Star & Pine Trees, Noel & Holly, Starlit Snowmen, Star Flakes and more. See ya at the library!

#### TIPS, TOOLS & TRICKS BY Janice Haralson

Four ways to make a perfect circle. . . .

First, try using ARDCO CRW-1S Circles. These are circles that range from ½ inch to 3 ½ inches in size. The circles are ¼ inch wide and backed with sandpaper to prevent slippage. You can use these for yoyo's, clamshells or anytime a perfect circle is needed. Their website is ARDCO Templates or their address is Quiltsmith, LTD., 252 Cedar Road, Poquoson, VA 23662. Phone: 757-868-8073.

Another tool is a plastic circle template used in drafting classes. The circles range from  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch to 3  $\frac{1}{2}$  inches. These tools are inexpensive and can be purchased on line for as little as \$1.97. You would use the template to draw the circle and then cut with shears or a rotary cutter.

Sharon Hultgren has designed the Easy Circle Cut which is a half circle template which is placed on the fabric fold. You can trace the circle or cut the circle with a rotary cutter using the template. The circle includes the ¼ inch seam allowance. The cost is about \$15.00. The EZ Quilting website has a tutorial on how to use the tool.

Lastly, OLFA has a rotary circle cutter which is easy to use and has a ratchet handle design which reduces wrist fatigue. With this tool you can cut circles from 1 7/8 to 8 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> inches. It can be used by right or left handed persons and can cut twelve layers at once safely. You can buy replacement blades. The cost is approximately \$20 and most quilt shops carry them.


