September Programs

Day Chapter - Libby Wallis will present our September program – "A Quilt Collectors Trunk Show." Libby began quilting and collecting quilts in the 1970's but it was not until the 1990's that she began collecting, quilting and studying quilt history. Libby's passion is quilt history and researching the quilts in her collection. She has researched an album quilt dating from the late 1880's, documenting the lives of four generations of women who migrated from South Carolina to Kansas and the family's struggle to live in a "free state."

Several of her quilts may be seen in Kansas City Star's Star Quilts and Star Quilts II Books. Her presentation to the BTQG will feature the best of her collection along with stories about collecting, decorating with quilts and quilt history.

Starlight Chapter -

Becky Goldsmith of Piece O' Cake Designs will present a lecture "Let's Talk About Color!" on Thursday evening September 6th at 7 p.m. at Fairview United Methodist Church. Becky poses this question "We walk around with our eyes open - but how much do we really see?" Her answer will explain what you can learn about color just by paying attention. Becky will share what she has figured out about color over the years and how she uses what she has learned in her quilts.

Becky graduated from Oklahoma University in 1978 with a degree in interior design. Her husband's career has taken them to Tempe, AZ, Tulsa, OK and most recently to Sherman, TX. Becky met her partner Linda Jenkins at the Green Country Quilter's Guild in Tulsa. Together they started Piece O' Cake Designs in 1994. Becky describes making quilts as "interesting, fulfilling and challenging." Running their business is not what Becky thought she would be doing with her life when she graduated from college but she says it is so much better than anything she could have imagined.

We are fortunate that Becky was able to rearrange her schedule after Linda Jenkins had to cancel due to health problems.

From the Presidents...

Day Chapter

As promised there will be a theme for show'n tell each month. This is in addition to whatever people bring for the usual show'n tell. For September the theme will be Friendship Quilts. If you have been the recipient of blocks from the friendship quilt program bring your finished quilt or quilt top to the September meeting. Potentially there could be literally hundreds as each chapter has had friendship drawings for twenty years. The goal has always been to share the completed top three months after the blocks have been returned. We won't be asking you to tell us when your name was drawn.

Our second focus will be interest groups. We have groups on 30s quilts, appliqué, red work, and charm quilts to name a few. Since many of the interest groups can only accommodate the current numbers, new groups may be needed. If you are interested in forming a new interest group or a "bee" come prepared. A bee is a small group (6-10 people) that gathers for stitching, conversation, and mutual support. It does not have to center on any particular type of quilt. We are inviting the current interest groups to share information and examples.

It is a tradition and regionally popular in the Perkiomen Valley of Pennsylvania. While it has the simplicity of a nine patch, it encompasses the flexibility of log cabin. Class Fee: \$45.00.

If you would like the library to purchase a book that is of interest to you please email me at gbnichols@charter.net and I will be glad to look into purchasing it for the library.

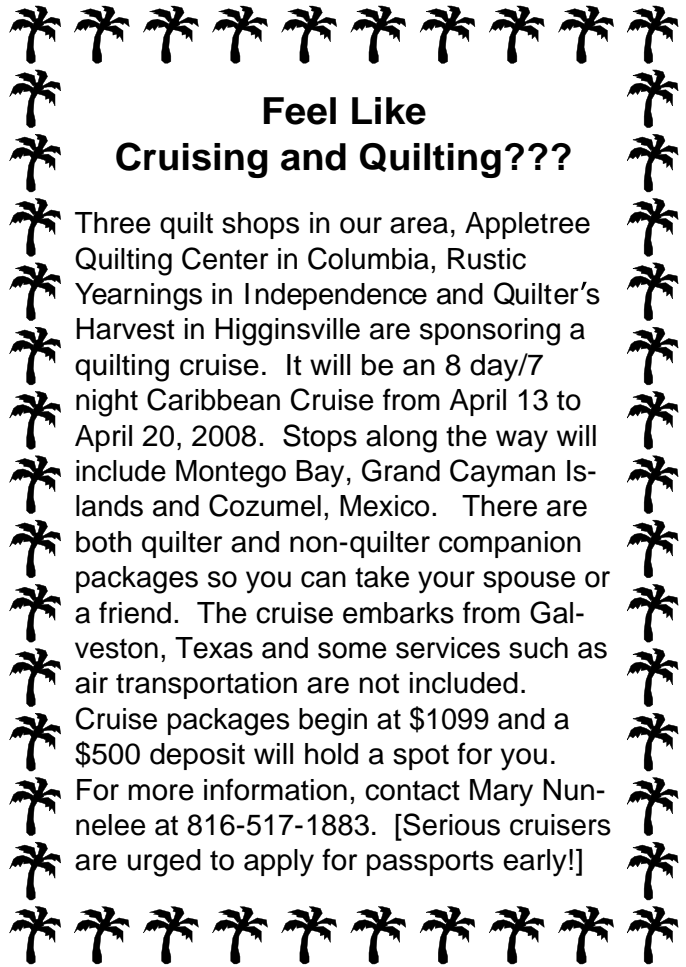

TIPS, TOOLS & TRICKS

Grab a needle and thread, it's time to make yo-yos. Clover Needlecraft's new tool makes it easy to create round, flower, or heart shaped yo-yos in various sizes in a flash. Just place your fabric between the disc and the plate, snap the pieces together, then hand stitch through the holes. Pop out the disc, pull the thread tightly, knot and you're done. Your yo-yo will have a hem and finished edge for the center. You can make your own original yo-yo projects.

To help finish the yo-yo's you can purchase washers from you local hardware store. Place the yo-yo's with washer inside and press with hot iron and starch. They will hold the press, so that you have a round circle yo-yo that can be attached with a finished edge.

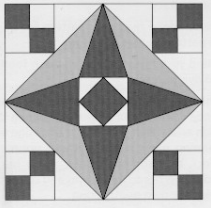

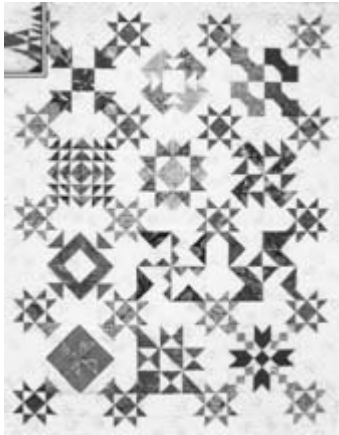
Appletree Quilting & Viking Center Guild Appreciation Discount For BTQG Members

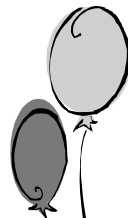

An EASY Foundation Pieced Wall Hanging

Presented by Connie Chunn

In this 3 hour class you will learn to make a simple tree quilt or wall hanging using an easy foundation paper piecing method. Won't it be nice to have something done ahead for yourself or as a gift for Christmas?
