Eggnog Dessert:**

2 pkg. (8 oz. each) cream cheese, softened

2 pkg. (3.4 oz. each) instant french vanilla pudding mix

2 cups cold eggnog (I use Central Dairy Eggnog) (NOTE: REDUCED FAT EGGNOG IS NOT REC-OMMENDED)

2 Cups cold milk

1/2 teaspoon rum extract

1/8 teaspoon ground nutmeg

1 small carton Cool Whip thawed (NOTE: If you prefer, use 1 cup heavy whipping cream that you have beaten into stiff peaks and then fold into mixture instead.)

- ★ In a large mixing bowl beat the cream cheese until smooth. Beat in pudding mixes, eggnog, milk, rum extract and ground nutmeg until smooth.
- ★ Fold whipped topping into pudding mixture.
- ★ Use a 2 oz. disher and fill 36 aluminum foil muffin cups. Garnish with Pirouette Cookies cut into serving size pieces.

[Alternate serving method: make a craham cracker crust: Combine 1/2 cup graham cracker crumbs and 1/4 cup butter and press into bottom of a greased spring form pan and spoon the pudding mixture over the crust.]

★ Refrigerate at least 4 hours or overnight. This can be frozen.

BUS TRIP TO THE INTERNATIONAL QUILT STUDY CENTER & MUSEUM (IQSC&M)

The Day Chapter is sponsoring a bus trip to the IQSC&M May 15 and 16, 2009. The bus will leave Columbia Friday, May 15, stop at a couple of quilt shops, a wool factory outlet, and lunch, arriving in Lincoln late afternoon.

Saturday will be spent at the Quilt Study Center where two special exhibits will be on display. Arrangements will be made for a guided tour of these exhibits led by a docent volunteer. The exhibits will be Chintz Appliqué: From Imitation to Icon and second, the Quilts of Grace Snyder.* Also, at all times, there are normally 50-75 quilts hung in the galleries.

The IQSC&M also offers a "behind the scenes tour" of their collections storage and photography studio. There is an extra \$25 charge for this portion of the tour since it requires considerable professional staff time and the size of the each tour is limited to 10 people. We will make special arrangements so everyone interested in the extended tour will be included. The Museum has a wheelchair available. Plus, if we need more than one wheelchair, we will bring them along on the bus. The bus will depart for home with a quick stop for dinner arriving back in Columbia about 10:00 PM.

The cost for the bus, a double room and admission to the Museum will be \$130.00. Breakfast is provided, but lunch and dinner both days will be additional. The behind-the-scenes tour cost of \$25 will also be additional. *Registration forms for this trip will be included in the February issue of the Newsletter.* The website is <u>www.quiltstudy.org</u>. *We have a biography of Grace Snyder in our Guild Library titled NO TIME ON MY HANDS. This book is a remarkable chronicle of the sod house era and of Grace Snyder's married life on a ranch in Nebraska's sand hills. She died at the age of 100, living to see her quilts contribute to a worldwide revival of quilt making.
