### TIPS, TOOLS & TRICKS

To keep your quilts fresh and keep them lasting forever (or until some child wears them out from dragging them around), I would like to recommend a fabulous product to help keep them that way, SOAK! The best part about this product—you don't rinse it out! Just soak your quilt in a tub using a tiny bit of SOAK mixed with water(cold, warm, whatever) for 15 minutes, then squeeze the water out. Let dry and you are set.

Washing a BIG quilt? Put it inside a laundry basket (with holes) in the tub. Fill the tub with water and a teaspoon of SOAK. After 15 minutes, drain the water and gently squeeze the quilt inside the laundry basket. Then, lift the basket out of the tub, roll the quilt out where you can lay it out to dry. No stretching, no dripping-just a nice, fresh quilt.

Soak is a biodegradable, phosphate-free formulation, gentle on fibers and on hands. It comes in three different fragrances: Flora, Aquae and Citrus and is also endorsed by Thimbleberries. It costs \$14.95 for a 425 ml. bottle. You can get it from Dilllards, Coltilde, Harper's Fabric and Quilt Shop in Overland Park, KS and other on-line fabric shops. It was created for yarn, but found to be great for quilts and fabrics.

ON ANOTHER NOTE: I would like to recommend that you consider doing some Postcard Quilts for the Troops. Penny Halgren, 7925 Pasadena Ave., La Mesa, CA 92941 is seeking Postcard Quilts for the troops for July 4th. If you would like to help her, you can find more information at <a href="https://www.FabricPostcards.com">www.FabricPostcards.com</a>. She needs help and has examples of cards that can be delivered at this website. She sent several thousand last year and would appreciate more this year.

#### NEWS FROM THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

The Board voted to change Item 2 of the Policies of the BTQG. It was amended to read as follows: Members of the Guild are not paid for presentations to the Guild membership. Members of the Guild may be paid to present workshops for Guild members for which a fee is charged.

The raffle quilt for the 2008 quilt show has now been completed by the 30's group and was quilted by Tammy Bush. The Board voted to earmark 50% of the proceeds from this raffle, up to an amount of \$1,500.00, to go to the Columbia CASA Program (Court Appointed Special Advocates for Children).

The Board voted to increase the admission fee to the 2008 Quilt Show to \$5.

#### Quilt Show Etiquette [Part I]\*

With the BTQG quilt show on the horizon, it might be helpful, particularly to those new to quilting, to look closer into the quilt show world and the etiquette attendant thereto. Even if you aren't new to quilting, this might be a refresher course.

What is a "white glove volunteer" and why do we have them? The white gloved volunteer is on hand to assist the viewing public with seeing (and not touching) the quilts. When requested, they can turn the quilt to the back so that stitching and even embellishment can be seen from both sides. Some shows now provide disposable gloves to attendees so that quilts will not be accidentally touched because oils and perfumes from the skin surface can damage the fabric or workmanship.

What about photographing quilts? Quilt show etiquette dictates that you ask permission prior to taking photographs. With today's technological advances, at some quilt shows, you may even be asked to check your cell phone prior to entering the viewing area.

<u>Food, drink and rolling bags</u>? Food and drink are prohibited for obvious reasons and more and more shows are restricting the use of rolling bags and baby strollers to eliminate the possibility of damage to exhibited quilts.

Things to consider when deciding whether to exhibit a quilt. First, there is the question of whether to enter the quilt for "display only" or enter a judged or juried show. The BTQG show is a display only show but some of our members enter their quilts for judging in statewide and national shows. A "display only" quilt means that even if the show is judged, that particular quilt will be held out of any competition or award system. It will not be considered for any prize.

The processes of jurying and judging are often misunderstood by inexperienced show entrants. In our August Quilt-O-Gram we will discuss the differences in those processes. For those of us who attended the annual meeting and heard Suzanne Marshall talk about the comments she received back on the quilts she entered in the various shows, it is clear that for novices in the quilt show world, entering a quilt for judging can be daunting.

We do not keep a record quilt donors, so we have no way of contacting you individually.

We still have some quilt kits left. They will still be available for pick up at the meetings. Our time as committee chairs is ending and we're beginning to sort out all our wonderful goodies before the next person takes over. If you're in an interest group or on a committee that has a need for fabric, let us know and we'll arrange for you to peruse July's poolroom store.

My quilt is an adaptation of Karen Stone's 'Delirious' pattern. It is made of a rainbow of bright colors. It was such a wonderful experience to have won. My quilt, as well as my photo were in the July issue of American Quilter, and my quilt will be featured in the 2009 AQS Wall Calendar. Today I sent it off to 'Quilter's Newsletter Magazine' to be photographed. I don't yet know how they plan to use the image of my quilt. I am so excited about the attention my quilt is receiving."


