# From the CEO...

The board held its meeting on May 11 and there is a lot going on---plans are nearing completion for the special speaker, retreats, and chapter meetings. The annual meeting is June 6<sup>th</sup> and I hope that we have good attendance. Not only will the members present be asked to approve the budget, but several by-law changes have been suggested. The board approved by majority vote one of these changes; the other recommended changes were not submitted to the board. I hope that you will consider this carefully and join us at the annual meeting to take part in this vote.

The budget committee met May 8<sup>th</sup> and by majority vote approved a request to the membership for a raise in dues from \$30 to \$35 annually. This decision was not made lightly. At the annual meeting, members will be given a budget which includes \$4,200 in support for each chapter for their regular meetings. If the dues increase is not approved, we will have two choices: to raise money from another source, or cut the budget in programs or newsletter, our two large budget items. The budget committee voted to increase dues as the fairest way to share the costs of our guild. The board supports this decision, again by majority vote. This will allow us to continue to offer 26 programs annually to our members—and will cost each of us about 2 fat quarters!

In addition, the day chapter would like to continue to meet at the church in the morning preceding their meeting. This requires an additional \$900 in rent, which will be a separate fundraising budget item for the day chapter. This was requested by the day chapter president and approved by the budget committee. No further chapter fundraising is included in the budget, but the guild fundraising budget line item is \$1,720. The incoming board will develop a plan for the most effective way to raise this money.

Please contact me if you have any questions about these issues. I look forward to seeing you June 6<sup>th</sup>! It has been my honor to serve the guild as CEO this year, and I'm glad I've had an opportunity to get to know so many more of our members.

## By-laws amendment proposals: \*

- 1. Amend the first sentence of Article 2, Section 2 as follows: Annual dues shall be \$35.00 which include full membership rights in all chapters.
- 2. Delete Art 5, Sec.4, item 3.
- 3. Add: under Article 7 Finance:

Art 7, sec 4: Chapters may hold fundraising events to supplement budget allocations. All funds raised remain with the chapter until the end of the fiscal year and may be used with the discretion of the chapter board. Chapters will not be required to hold fundraising activities.

4. Add: under Article 7 - Finance:

Art 7, sec 5: Funds raised by any ad hoc committee for a specially designated project will revert to the general fund when the ad hoc committee completes its function. An ad hoc committee may be organized by either the Executive Board or by either Chapter board.

\*Said proposed amendments will be presented to the membership for vote at the Annual Meeting scheduled to be held on June 6, 2009 at 9:00 a,m, at the Peachtree Banquet Center, 120 E. Nifong, Suite D, Columbia, MO. The business meeting and program portions of the Annual Meeting are open to all members without charge.

# An editorial comment in favor of the Proposed Dues Increase...

This is a note in favor of the \$5.00 increase in the Guild dues. Over the past year the Day and Starlight Piecemaker Chapters were responsible for raising \$1000 of their expense budget (\$3000, total program budget). Both Chapter's accomplished this through the generous support of our members participating in the both auctions, numerous workshops, and donations.

This year the budget reflects these extra monies, \$2500, needing to be raised as a whole guild and not solely the responsibility of the Chapters. By raising the dues \$5.00 we would be able to offset the amount to be raised by \$1000, thus spreading the responsibility to all the members, and requiring the guild to raise only \$1500 to balance the budget.

Your \$35 membership would be divided accordingly: \$2.92/month, of which

\$1.50 goes for printing and mailing newsletter \$0.71 goes to <u>each</u> chapter for their rent and programs.

For those of you who shared you comments via the survey, the Chapter Programs and Newsletter were the two most important functions that "You" wanted from your Guild.

I know that several of our members are on a fixed budget and the Guild does not want to put undo stress on their budgeting. But I'm sure we could work something out if we need to so that we don't lose any member solely on the problem that she could not pay.

Remember that the retreats are self-supporting, and the Special Speaker, support of Fons & Porter, and the Heartland Quilting Group are ways we try to give a little extra back to our members and the community as a non-for profit group.

I know that we have some monies left over from the quilt show last year, and half of that is being included as carry over for this year and the remainder for next year. And, the two CD's are there to assure us that we would have a least one-year budget available in case the Guild was to have a very lean year.

Please be sure to attend the Annual Meeting and let your opinions be heard through your vote.

# An editorial comment against the Proposed Dues Increase. . .

Here's what I think... we don't need to increase the dues right now. We need more creative thinking about how to keep costs down. We need more participation in program planning and presentation. And, we need to be aware we may not be able to sustain membership if we increase dues too often. These are tentative times for many of our members. Do we really want to increase the dues of an organization that provides information and camaraderie? We have reserve funds. Why not use more of the reserve and hold off on the dues increase—at least for another year or two?

I am a founding member of this guild and I can tell you that we have had smaller reserves and managed to build back financially. We can do so again. Get off the panic button and think of solutions other than a simply throwing an extra \$5 per person at the budget.

Just three years ago the board reluctantly, with membership approval, increased the dues to \$30. This current proposal would increase the dues from \$25 to \$35 in just over four years. That's a net increase of 40%. While an additional \$5 may not seem significant, in proportion it is.

The increase requires an amendment to the bylaws. That must be done by majority vote of the membership at the annual meeting. Please consider the proposal carefully. Think about options that would keep our costs down and options that would bring income from other than dues sources. Then, come to the meeting, make an informed decision and cast your vote. **Bettina Havig**

We worked more than a year on the quilt, grumbling a lot because most of us did not enjoy working with such tiny pieces. The 81" by 88" finished quilt is truly gorgeous, all 180 flowers, no two alike. We've almost forgotten all the work. Almost.







## Tips, Tricks, Tools & Tidbits

Our new product this month is Texture Magic from Superior Threads. You have to see this to believe what it does. It is a steam-activated fabric that shrinks 30% in all directions. Simply sew Texture Magic to your fabric, stitch a design, steam it (don't iron it), and watch what happens. It is great for quilting, art quilts, and wearable art. The package comes in a 47" X 18" size, complete with instructions. To see what fun you can have with this product, go to www.superiorthreads.com/newsletters.

<u>Tip</u>: Consider using Titanium-coated needles for the regular sewing machine. The industrial and commercial companies have been using these for several years. The titanium-coated needles have an ultra thin coat of titanium nitride layered on the surface to extend their productive life by five to eight times that of conventional needles. Most professionals recommend changing the needle every project, or if you count, every 8 hours. Imagine having a needle that will last 40 to 60 hours. This is equivalent to saving 80% on the cost of needles.

In the world of needles, titanium-coated needles are much more wear resistant than conventional chromium plated needles. Titanium-coated needles provide perfect reliability and durability in prolonged stitching operations. Non-titanium needle companies spread rumors that titanium-coated needles are too hard and therefore will damage your machine if they break. Research and testing do not support that claim. If that rumor were true, industrial companies would have rejected these needles many years ago.

The majority of professionals and educators work with using the Topstitch needle for nearly all their sewing. It is simply the best needle style for quilting, embroidery, and most sewing applications. You really need only three needles:

Topstitch #80/12 for piecing and sewing with fine threads

Topstitch #90/14 for the majority of threads

Topstitch #100/16 for heavier threads

How about for metallic threads? Use Topstitch #90/14. Under a microscope, other brands of metallic needles are almost identical to Topstitch. There is no need for both styles.

On the average, a single needle costs \$1.20 or about \$5.99 for a pack of five needles. For an additional 20 cents per needle, you can have the highest quality, the longest lasting (titanium coated), and the best designed needle. A pack of five needles sells for \$6.99.

- 1. Walking 20 minutes a day can add to your life. This enables you at 85 years old to spend an additional five months in a nursing home at \$7,000 per month.
- 2. Long walks are especially nice when taken by people who annoy you.
- 3. If you are going to walk, do it early in the morning before your brain figures out what you are doing.
- 4. We all get heavier as we get older because there is a lot more information in our heads.
