This just in from Heartland Quilt Network: A worthy project. . .

Each year Physician's With Heart, headquartered in Kansas City, goes to a former Russian country to provide medical care to an orphanage or school for the handicapped. They quickly realized that the children needed warm bedding. So they have asked guilds to make quilts that they take with them. This year they are visiting an orphanage in Georgia that was bombed during the short war last year in August between Georgia and Russia. They are asking for warm, heavy, but colorful quilts this year. We suggest that at least one side be flannel. The quilts need to be 50 x 80 inches, and they need to be in Kansas City by June 25th. Tips, Tools, Tricks & Tidbits By Janice Haralson

- Check out the Seams Sew Fast Quilt Strip Piecing Guide made by O'Lipfa. This tool takes the labor out of stripping and insures that each strip will be the same width. This quilt strip piecing guide is an adjustable clear plastic reusable guide which feeds strips through machine with ease and accuracy. It fastens to the sewing machine bed and will guide the fabric strips into the "sleeve" slider. This product can be seen on www.olipfa.com for tips and a demonstration.
- Seam allowances should be pressed toward the darkest fabric so they will be less noticeable. Setting the seam before pressing will help keep the seam easier to press.
- ★ To square up your blocks perfectly before sewing your quilt top together, mark your ironing board cover with the size square you are after using a permanent marking pen.

From Friendship Block Winner-Day Chapter -- Ann Rennier. .

I've been quilting since I was in high school (don't ask!) My mom and I both have a love affair with fabric and I love being able to share that with her. I helped her with Yo-Yo projects and she took off with that. Growing up, my next door neighbor was a seamstress and she helped me with garment making which lead to having a fabric stash of my very own. Years ago, Nancy Graviett and I would watch Eleanor Burns' videos together and make quilt projects. We would have to rewind the VHS tape so many times because we would be laughing so much we missed the directions. Our husbands thought we were crazy!

The guild has been a part of my life since I moved to Columbia 11 years ago. I think that was when I knew I was a quilter. All the new friends that I made helped me adjust to the move and living outside the city. Everyone that I met was so talented and I just loved being around women who enjoyed having fabric in their lives.

My block choice will be a churn dash using 1800s reproduction fabrics. I've always loved this block because of the vintage feel. It is simple and charming!

HOW TO DATE QUILTS Presented By Merikay Waldvogel

<u>About Merikay</u>: She is the 2009 inductee into the Quilters Hall of Fame and an expert on quilt history. She has been studying quilt history for more than 25 years and is the author of several books including PATCHWORKS SOUVENIRS, CHILDHOOD TREASURES: Quilts By and For Children, and SOFT COVERS FOR HARD TIMES. She has amassed a large collection of quilt ephemera and maintains and extensive data base on early kits for quilts.

In this workshop, you will get an overview of quilt history and look at the vintages of both quilts and fabric. Don't miss this rare opportunity to learn from a quilt historian. Feel free to bring a quilt for discussion.

Lemon Squares

By Shirley Bulski [baker extraordinaire]

c. (2 sticks) Butter, softened
c. + 2 tbls. Powdered sugar
2 1/3 c. Flour (divided)
4 Eggs
2 c. granulated sugar
1/3 c. Fresh lemon juice + zest
1 tsp. Baking powder

In a large bowl, cream together butter and $\frac{1}{2}$ c. powdered sugar until fluffy. Add 2 c. flour, beating until blended. Spread this mixture evenly over the bottom of a well greased 13 x 9" pan. Bake@ 350 degrees for 20 minutes.

Meanwhile, in a mixer bowl, beat eggs until light and foamy. Gradually add granulated sugar, beating until thick and blended. Add lemon juice and remaining 1/3 c. flour and baking powder. Beat well until blended.

Pour lemon mixture over baked crust and bake about 25 minutes until golden in color and custard is set. Remove from oven, cool and sprinkle evenly with remaining powdered sugar (2 tbls.) Cut in squares. Makes 20-24 bars.

Rules for Quilting

Always buy fabric no matter how much you already have.
Sew All Day and All Night - absolutely no cooking allowed.
Use a lot of spit for tiny droplets of blood; this always makes the quilt personal.

4. Always start a new quilt before the last one is finished. This requires you to go back to step # 1.

From Starlight Piecemakers Friendship Block Winner — Tammy Bush...

I worked as a pediatric nurse and educator until about ten years ago. My husband's schedule became hard to work around so we decided that I'd stay home a few years. I'm still home.

I grew up in Missouri and Kansas. We moved a lot. I learned to sew from my mom and in 4-H and made most of my nice clothes. I loved knowing how to sew as it helped in decorating my various homes with pillows, curtains and slipcovers for bargain prices! I still love that. I met my husband Ric, a pharmacist, while working in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia in 1987. We married in 1989, spent several years in Saudi altogether and eventually came to Columbia. I have two boys, Michael (16) and Matthew (14).

I made my first quilt in college, the second about ten years later. I didn't know what I was doing with either one. I had a friend who quilted and she took me to her group where I learned the basics. She then introduced me to Kim Diamond and the long-arm machine. Kim wanted some help with her expanding business and I needed a creative outlet. Kim taught me to do custom work and it is still my favorite, even though it is more tedious and time consuming than all-over patterns. After a few years of working for and being coached by Kim, I started my own quilting service. I doubt I would have done that if she hadn't stopped quilting for others and encouraged me to start.

I am drawn to appliqué quilts artistically. I'm still a long way from the quality of the Susan Gilmore's of the guild. 30's fabrics make me feel happy and peaceful. I can't really say I have a favorite; I like things done really well. A stunning quilt in any style works for me. Right now, I'm working with stripes.

My other interests are gardening, my boys, and Bible study. If it weren't for the biting insects in the summer I would get no quilting done, because I love working in the yard and being outside.

For my block, I am doing a 3-D version of the friendship star. It is so simple and I thought it would be a fun and happy quilt.

THE FINE ART OF HAND QUILTING WORKSHOP*

This sampler of quilting designs in a 15 inch pillow top is designed to sharpen your quilting skills, achieve a smaller more even stitch and help you develop good quilting techniques. A kit with fabric, batting and premarked design will be provided.

Supplies:

- \star White or off white cotton quilting thread
- \star Pencil and sharpener
- ★ Quilting needles/betweens, size 8 or smaller- I use a size 11.
- ★ Silver pencil and /or washable graphite pencil or other safe marking pencil
- ★ Basting needle i.e. a long fine needle and plain white or light color thread for basting
- ★ THIMBLE (or other protective device) <u>Notice the capital letters</u>!
- ★ 1/2" or 3/4" masking tape
- ★ Quilting hoop (a 12" or 14" hoop (round) works best)
- ★ Scissors

Pre-registration is required; the workshop fee is \$20 and includes the kit. (Attendees must also purchase a \$5.00 soup & salad lunch in exchange for use of the room.) Since the top will be partially pre-marked, a <u>firm</u> registraton count is needed no later than May 15, 2009. Maximum is 20 people.

- ★ In a 1998 issue of our Quilt-A-Gram, Bettina Havig listed nationally recognized speakers that the guild has invited for some of our workshops and lectures. Some of these included Chris Wolf Edmonds, Roberta Horton, Jinny Beyer, Cheryl Bradkin, Helen Kelley, Nancy Halpern, Elly Sienkiewicz, Nancy Pearson, Doreen Speckmann, Liz Porter, and Marianne Fons. Betty Hagerman (the Sunbonnet Lady) even spoke pro bono "because she thought it was the friendly thing to do."
- ★ 1997: Shirley Troth gave a two-hour talk, requested by the Optimist Club, at their regional meeting. Her subject was quilts (of course). Connie Rice, Marilynn Lee, and Jackie Pruneau assisted her by holding quilts during the lecture.

"The University of Nebraska-Lincoln recently received an amazing gift. In April of 1997, Robert and Ardis James donated 950 antique and contemporary quilts from their collection. This collection is one of the largest and most comprehensive in the world and features quilts dating from the 1700's to 1992 from the United States, Europe, and Japan. The Jameses plan to donate a \$1 million endowed gift to the newly established International Quilt Study Center at the University. As part of the agreement, the University of Nebraska Foundation will seek an additional \$2 million to support research, exhibition, acquisitions and conservation of the collection. The acquisition of this quilt collection will allow the University to become the leading academic institution offering courses and symposiums focused on quilts and quilt makers in the context of textile history, social history, art and art history. The Center will serve as a magnet for na tional textile scholars who will provide lectures, symposia, and exhibits."

To clean your OLFA mat, use a generous amount of room temperature water and a few drops of mild detergent. Use a soft, mild bristle brush to create a lather and gently clean your mat. Rinse with room temperature water and wipe dry with a cotton towel. Please note that warm or hot water and direct sunlight may damage the mat.
