\*Sewing machine in good working order

\*Neutral thread

\*Basic sewing kit; pins, seam ripper, scissors

\*Rotary cutter and mat

\*Rotary ruler 6"x12" or 4"x8" AND 6"x6" or 6.5"x6.5" square

## History items from various past newsletters of the guild

from the historian, Sharon Lawler

The monthly drawings for Friendship blocks began in **1985 or 1986**.

In **October 1989** was an all night Quilt-In at St. Andrews Church from 5 p.m. Friday until noon on Saturday. Shakespeare pizza was the dinner and various members brought snacks and sodas.

Boo! Kula joined the guild in **November 1989**, along with Chris McKinstry, Edna Cooper, Mary Marsan, Ramona McClain, Dana Sheahen, and Marilyn Deurman. This brought the membership total to 166.

In **1989**, handmade Christmas ornaments were exchanged by interested guild members as a part of the December program.

Flavin Glover [from Alabama?] taught two, all-day workshops in **October 1989**. Each workshop cost \$25 to participate. One workshop was on small scale quilts and wallhangings, adapting traditional patchwork patterns to small scale compositions and also pointers on use of color. The other workshop was on innovative log cabin designs and the versatility of this design, fabric selections to gain proper spatial perspectives, and the use of appliqué within the design.

The Evening Quilters pieced and quilted a Bears Paw pattern quilt to donate to University Hospital's June 1990 Children's Miracle Network telethon. Funds from the University Hospital's raffle of the quilt stay in the Mid Missouri area. Mary Reddick of the Feather Circle Quilt shop contributed fabric to the project. Co-leaders in the project, Sandy Sartain and Lou Beasley, chose fabrics from the Windsor Collection for the quilt; colors included a green floral, dark turkey red, and champagne. Twelve members made blocks, and other members contributed for fabric and batting for the quilt. The quilt was finished and presented to the hospital in **January 1990** to begin the raffle.

The **1990** quilt show was held in May at the new Historical Society Building, from Thursday night through Sunday, May 10 through May 13. The guild planned their largest ever display of quilts. This was the 11<sup>th</sup> annual quilt show.

Carol Virkler, **1989-90** BTQG Board president, shared this verse in the newsletter:

"Love is a quilt—a quilt is love.

Both love and a quilt should be:

Soft enough to comfort you,

Bright enough to cheer you,

Generous enough to enfold you,

Light enough to let you move freely,

Strong enough to withstand adversity,

Durable enough to last a lifetime,

And given gladly, from the heart."

We are not going to offer any products that either of our local shops stock. If the products become popular maybe one of the shops will introduce them in their shops.

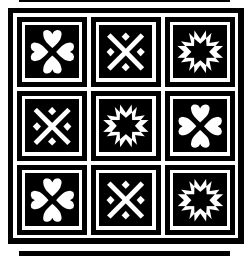
