I Proposed Bylaw Changes—Changes proposed are in **Bold** 

**Article 3 – Membership Meetings** (page 2)

Section 4: Any member of the general membership shall be entitled to vote by ballot. Said ballot shall be sent to each member at least one week prior to the date of the annual meeting or special business meeting.

**Article 4 – Board of Directors** (page 2)

**Section 3:** Duties of the Board of Directors (page 2)

5. Board members shall attend board meetings. Board members who fail to attend three consecutive board meetings may be asked to resign.

**Article 5 – Chapter Officers and Executive Committees** 

**Section 5: Board** (page 4)

The chapter boards shall meet at a time determined by its members and at least bimonthly.

Board members shall attend board meetings. Board members who fail to attend three consecutive board meetings may be asked to resign.

**Article 6 – Nominations and Elections** (page 4)

Section 1: A slate of **the Executive Committee** for the Board of Directors of the Guild and Chapter(s) Executive Committee(s) shall be presented no later than the May meeting. Floor nominations will close at the May meetings.

**Article 8 – Parliamentary Procedures** (page 5)

Section 1: The Parliamentary **procedure** in all matters not covered by these Bylaws shall be Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised **unless superceded by Missouri Revised Statues for nonprofit corporations.** 

**Article 9 – Amendments** (page 5)

**Section 1:** The By-laws may be amended at the Guild annual meeting or at any special business meeting of the Guild membership by a 2/3 vote provided a quorum **of 10%** of the membership is present, and that the amendment has been submitted in writing at a previous meeting(s) or that a copy has been sent to each member at least one week prior to the meeting.


### SILENT AUCTION


