



# Changes to Policies of Booneslick Trail Quilters Guild

- Voting Procedure 12.
- 1. Every member is entitled to one vote per issue. Said vote may be cast person or in abstention.
- 2. Ballots, to be eligible for the count, must be signed and dated by the individual member casting the vote and must be received at the BTQG P.O. Box 542, Columbia, MO 65205 no less than two (2) days prior to the date of the meeting wherein the vote will be taken. Ballots not received timely will not be counted.
- 3. The CEO or the Treasurer of the Board of Directors shall be responsible for retrieving all mailed ballots.
- 4. All ballots shall be counted at the annual or special meeting.

## May Friendship Block-Day

Hi! I'm Betty White and I'm very happy to be the winner of the Friendship Block for May. I retired in 2006, after teaching Family and Consumer Sciences (Home Economics) for 35 years, the last 32 in Hallsville. I'm one of those people who came to the Columbia area for college and just stayed on. My husband, John, is retired from the University of Missouri and plays and teaches old time traditional fiddle music. We have two grown children, one in Seattle, WA and one in Columbia.

I learned to sew as a 4-H member and actually machine pieced two quilt top as part of a Home Management project. College and job seemed to replace sewing until I took a Missouri Sampler class with Betinna Havig at The Quilt Cottage in

1977 or 78. That class resulted in a hand-pieced, king-sized top ready for quilting. (I finally gave up quilting it myself and sent it to the Amish for quilting.) Children and life took over until I was again bitten by the quilting bug around 2000.

Since retirement, I have combined my quilting interest with a desire to travel. I took my first "quilt related trip" to see autumn in New England and I have taken at least one (if not more) trip each year since. I'm looking forward to a "Quilt Camp at Sea" cruise to Alaska the end of lune.

I also enjoy reading quilt-related novels and mysteries. This interest has helped me with my block selection for this project. I have been fascinated by traditional friendship blocks bearing the signatures of friends and family. Then after reading Sandra Dallas' Persian Pickle Club and the account of the autograph quilt, I have decided that is the direction I want this quilt to take.

I have picked a simple star pattern with an insert for your autograph. I will provide the background and ask you to check you stash for *PURPLE*. This has always been my favorite color and I hope that you can help me make a scrappy quilt with a wide variety of purple. Since I do have a fair stash of purple myself, I will have some available if your stash is limited. I will also have several purple cloth marker waiting for you to use for your signature when you return the block.

I'm looking forward to seeing you at the June Day Chapter meeting.

#### **Proposed Bylaw Changes**

In the course of preparing the proposed budget for FY 2010/2011, the budget committee discussed and would like to propose two by-law changes to be considered by the membership.

The result of this first change would give authority for appointing committee chairpersons and establishing special ad-hoc committees to the Executive Committee rather than solely by the CEO. (Note: the executive committee is made up of the four elected board members - CEO, VP, Treasurer and Secretary) This change would foster teamwork among the Executive Board members and eliminate possible and/or perceived favoritism.

The result of the second change would allow members willing to accept the position of chair of a committee the authority, along with the responsibility to carry out the job. Responsibility cannot be expected without allowing the authority to complete the task and this right should be equally applied to all.
