### Day Friendship Quilt Block Winner

I am so excited to be the Day Friendship Quilt Block winner for October. My name is Marilyn Smith and I have been a guild member for 3 years. Just this past year, I have finally been able to become more involved in the guild and I started making friendship blocks because I enjoy trying new piecing patterns.....I haven't been quilting very long. The block I have chosen is Crossed Canoes and I would like to make a scrappy quilt in red and white.

I started quilting in 2006 after a lifetime of sewing. I really like the creative process and in the past I have done crochet, macrame, decoupage, embroidery, doll-making, garment making, drawing, painting.....well, you get the picture.

In 2008 I was so surprised (shocked) to win awards at AQS Paducah, and the Houston IQA Quilt Show, with my quilt, "Joy". It was an exciting experience and led to other equally exciting things. My quilt was in the November 2008 Quilter's Newsletter Magazine, the 2009 AQS Wall Calendar and is in the 2010 IQA Calendar.

I have been a widow for 10 years now and my son and I farm together. This time of year I am in the fields driving a truck or tractor and wagon, harvesting soybeans and corn from the 2200 acres of row crops that we farm in northwest Callaway County. It was never my intention to farm....in fact, I really never wanted to farm, but my husband did and so we farmed. Never did I ever dream that I would one day be THE farmer. I have been a registered nurse and have also taught junior high language arts and social studies. The best job I ever had, however, was being a mother and a wife.

I have married children ( Jason and Rachel) and am extremely busy with my five grandchildren and my mother . I teach an adult Sunday School class at my church and am involved in the Hatton Community Club. One of our latest acquisitions in the library is a gift from Bettina Havig of her latest and seventh book "Across the Pond - Projects Inspired by Quilts of the British Isles." Bettina takes us on a pictorial and narrative account of her journeys and experiences in the British Isles as she introduces us to the quilts and quilters of Britain, Wales and Ireland. Included among the projects in the book are scrappy quilts, a whole cloth quilt project, medallion quilts, and instructions for making a Victorian Etui. You won't want to miss this book.

### Quilt Care in a Nutshell A Few Free Tips

by Patricia L. Cummings, Quilter's Muse Publications

- 1. Remember that quilts like the same environment as humans. Do not store quilts in unheated areas, in plastic bags, or in high humidity. Attics, garages, and basements are a no-no.
- 2. Really think twice about wet-washing a quilt. Irreparable damage can occur, especially to antique quilts.
- 3. Wear gloves when handling old guilts to protect YOURSELF from possible surface contaminants.
- 4. In hanging a quilt, old or new, make sure that it is adequately supported. No push pins, please!
- 5. Do not leave quilts hanging vertically for a long time. Every 3-6 months, let them rest for the same amount of time they have hung vertically.
- 6. Never fold a quilt or textile the same way every time. Insert padding in the folds. Polyester batting is an inert substance that will not damage the quilt. Acid-free, lignin-free, archival tissue paper can be purchased from <u>Gaylord</u> or other archival supply companies. Fold it, accordion style, to stuff into the folds.
- 7. Dry cleaning utilizes chemicals that are potentially carcinogenic. Avoid dry cleaning any quilts. The solvent will saturate the batting and remain inside.
- 8. Hang quilts in interior spaces, not on outside walls of your home, to help prevent mildew from forming on the reverse side, from changes in temperature and humidity.
- 9. Paint wood surfaces and seal them with two coats of polyacrylic before letting them come in contact with quilts or textiles. Another barrier for preventing wood acid migration is aluminum foil. When storing a quilt in a box, wrap the outside of the folded quilt in desized muslin, available at the source indicated in my book, <u>Straight Talk About Quilt Care</u>, now online at: <a href="http://www.quiltersmuse.com">http://www.quiltersmuse.com</a>
- 10. Replace acid-free tissue as soon as it yellows, or as soon as a ph indicator pen shows that the paper has regained an unacceptable level of acidity.

Above all, enjoy your quilt!


