

For those members who wish to purchase an extra copy of the book, a limited number of books will be available for \$1.00 each.

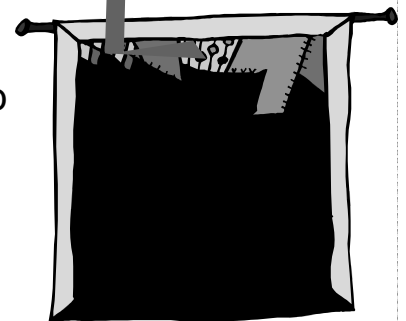
Quilt show Committee Report

24th Annual BTQG Retreat

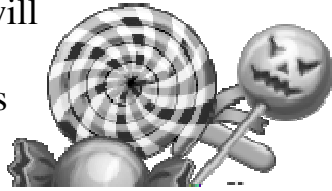
