

LIBRARY NEWS

A wonderful team of volunteers inventoried our library on the 8th. Everything is much neater and easier to find now. We made a few changes in how the materials are organized. Books and materials are still in order by author, editor or publisher, although we found some that needed to be reclassified. *Recreational Reading*, which includes novels, other fiction, humorous and spiritual books related to quilting, now has its own section. *Special Reference* (previously called "heirloom") books have been marked with stickers for easy identification, but are still in with the regular collection. Non book items, such as videos and tools, are also separate.

To assist you in finding what you want, we keep lists of the materials at the desk and on the web site by author and by subject. Of course, you can just browse through the collection or ask our friendly library assistants for help too. I'm working on updating the lists as well as the database now that the inventory is completed. Early next year we will also identify books to "deacquisition", or remove from our collection. These will be sold to benefit the guild.
