

Quilt Challenge - It's Not Too Late !

Quilt Challenges are to tempt you to step beyond your usual quilt expectations or choices. To fit our theme of Quilt Expressions, the major component of this year's quilt challenge is to use words! A line of poetry, a humorous expression that brings a smile, some goal or aspiration you want to share.

Here are the rules; but they are only very general, so that your creative spirit can fly:

Challenge Rules

1. The overall size of your finished piece must be a minimum of 12 inches (12" x 12") square.

- 2. There is no limit to the maximum overall size of the finished piece.
- 3. The challenge piece must have at least 5 English words anywhere within the piece.
- 4. Some of the fabric supplied must be used in the quilt. It may be dyed, tinted or otherwise altered.
- 5. Any and all embellishments are OK beads, buttons, feathers, thread painting, painting, photos or other stuff!
- 6. You may enter as many times as you wish.
- 7. Larger quilts must have a 4 inch sleeve on the back at the top. Smaller pieces must have a way to hang on fabric background.
- 8. It must include a label. You may also include a write up to explain your inspiration.

We have a limited amount of fabric, so let me know at August quild meetings.

You will need the size to enter on line.

Fall Lecture & Workshop - Froncie Quinn Wed. & Thurs. - September 8-9, 2010

We are quite pleased this year to be able to offer you a lecture and workshop to be conducted by Froncie Quinn. For those of you who are not acquainted with Froncie, she is licensed by the Shelburne Museum, Sturbridge Village, Vermont Quilt Festival, and Lancaster Quilt & Textile Museum to write patterns for their beautiful quilts. When possible, her patterns include the Historical Method of construction and the Modern Method of construction, so the reproduction can be pieced by both the hand and the machine piecer.

In her classes, Froncie accommodates people with all skill levels whether they are beginners or quilters of many years. The workshop she will be presenting for us is called Sarah's Medallion. Early in the 19th century Sarah, aged only 14 in 1826, made a beautiful scrap quilt and in the quilt's center she pieced a medallion. We will be making that medallion which will make a lovely wall hanging.

The cost for the all-day workshop will be \$45 **plus** approximately \$15 for the purchase of the pattern. Templates will be provided, so piecing can begin immediately. The second part of the class will be spent on hand appliqué which takes no previous experience. The third portion of the class will be spent talking about signature blocks and quilt labels. For those who have computers, you can check out Froncie's website at <u>www.hooplapatterns.com</u>. The workshop registration form can be found elsewhere in this newsletter. *Please try to have your registration in by August 15. If we don't have at least 20 people enrolled after August 15, the workshop will be opened to non-members*.
