Ugly Quilt Contest

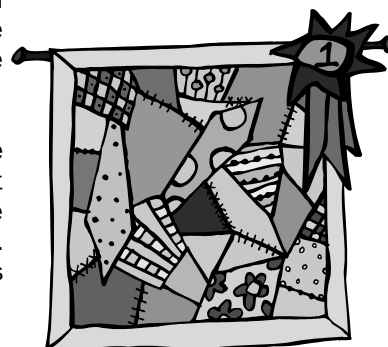
Have a good 4th of July and remember to come to the next day for our Day Chapter Guild meeting.

QUILT SHOW ENTRY FORM – QUILT EXPRESSIONS 2010

The BTQG quilt show Quilt Expressions 2010 will be November 6 and 7, 2010 at Stoney Creek Inn. We do not have as much space for hanging quilts but we are hoping to have 250 quilts to display. In order to get the program, map insert, and lay-out done in a timely manner, and accurately, our deadline this year is **September 30th (if mailed September 26th)**. SO..... **Start** planning your entries. (We are NOT taking applications at the October meetings.) You must be a paid member to enter a quilt or sponsor a quilt. No quilt may be entered that has been in a BTQG show in the last five years, unless it was voted "Viewer's Choice" in the previous show.

Again this year we **STRONGLY ENCOURAGE** you to type your entry directly into the form on the internet. This will make it much easier to do the labels. It also saves the guild money for printing costs. For those who sincerely shudder and shake at the thought of using the internet, we will be happy to accept the hand-written forms. For anyone who is submitting entries by hand, you will also need to fill in your claim check, except the areas marked "to be assigned". If you do on-line, the computer will fill in the claim check for you. It is quick and easy to do.

TO DO ON-LINE REGISTRATION, you need to know the information from the registration form, especially width and height (IN INCHES).

Note: This takes you to Jackie Berry's website. Not to worry we are using the entry form developed by Jackie's grandson Jordan for the 2008 quilt show since it worked so well.

2. Click on **Online Quilt Submission Application**. (We decided to eliminate the PASSWORD.)
3. Read the directions at the top, BUT basically you just click on each entry with your mouse and type. **Be sure you pull down the arrow that says type of entry** in order to choose Challenge, Friendship, Wall hanging, Decorative, etc. EASY.
4. When finished, hit "Submit Quilt."
5. Double check your typing for accuracy.
6. If okay, hit "submit my entry."
7. **Print your claim check and label** (all filled out for you) **before proceeding**.
8. Then either click on "Submit another quilt," or hit the red X in the upper right hand corner to close windows. Again EASY.

Note: If you choose "wearable" OR "decorative," identify the item by "decorative type," so that we can make arrangements to exhibit it properly. Then fill in approximate size. Also, there are a couple of new categories - "challenge quilt" and "education." So if you participated in the challenge or made a quilt or other item in a BTQG sponsored class or in a class taught at a retreat, we would like to display those.

I will be set up at the July, August and September meetings to answer any questions. If you already know and have finished some of your entries, please submit the forms early. IF you have any questions, you can also call me at 573-445-4217 or email morrisw@missouri.edu.

JUNE FRIENDSHIP BLOCK - DAY

Day Chapter's June Friendship Block Winner is Joan Pottinger

I have 2 sons and a daughter, 4 grandsons, 1 granddaughter, and a new grandbaby on the way in late August. I have recently started dabbling with miniatures after designing quilts for dollhouse beds, and am trying my hand at designing my own patterns.

While I have sewn most of my life, I only took up quilting after moving to Columbia in August 2002. Quilting is a way of expressing myself creatively and it became a way to make friends in a new community. My attendance at the Day Chapter has depended on the periods in my life when I have been unemployed or on medical leave. My current career is as a caregiver/companion for a remarkable almost 102 year-old lady. Ms Lucy has

become my role model in many ways and I learn from her each day as we share life.

I always do the friendship blocks as a way to learn new block patterns and try them out to see if I like them before committing time and money for a whole quilt of that block. And I enjoy finding "my" blocks I contributed to the Friendship blocks of fellow quilters when those completed quilts hang in our quilt shows. It's fun to spot my little part in the whole of a quilt and brings fond memories of the time I spent making them.

I like attending both chapters and especially cherish the friendships I have made at each chapter. That is why, when I was chosen for the Day chapter friendship block, I chose to use the same friendship block as I used recently at Starlight Piecemakers

chapter. Thus, my one quilt will encompass all my guild friends!

The pattern is a signed Friendship Star pattern I copied from an antique quilt in a childhood friend's mother's collection. I call it "My Garden of Friends." The block is simple to make and will be beautiful in bold, scrappy fabrics. It takes 4 signature blocks to make up one star in the pattern, so I plan to include some blank blocks in the quilt to allow for future quilting friends to sign.

JANE AUSTEN ERA QUILTS

The group is a "sit and stitch". The fabric selection emphasis will be 1800-1840. This is a much more elegant era, softer colors, delicate floral prints, use of toiles, Broderie Perse style appliqué, and fine quilting. The quilt making focus will be on the tradition of quilts shared by American and English quilt makers especially on frame or medallion quilts.

"Jane Austen" will meet bi-monthly in a home, mine or other member's, for one year. Whenever feasible we may include viewing an

Austen novel on film. We'll read Jane Austen's novels and discuss them. Due to space constraints participation will be limited or we can form more than one group—probably 6-8 in a group and no more than two groups. Let's read the novels in the order in which they were written.

I will help design the projects and provide consul on calculations and help with quilting motif designs. Any patterns provided will be available only to those in the group.

I will provide minimal instruction, you can work by hand or machine (by machine at home). We can share in design decisions by auditioning things at the meetings. Obviously free advice is not binding; no one has to abide by the suggestions.

Quilting, reading, and discussion are all part of the purpose. Join only if you are interested in all three.

The first organizational meeting will be July 13, 2010, 1 p.m. at my home... 1108 Sunset Lane. We can

discuss our options then. I do need to know if you plan to attend that first meeting.

intimidating, but it doesn't have to be. If you can balance your check book, you have all the skills required for Treasurer. Call me for more information.

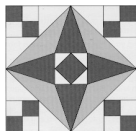
Historian - It is important that we document our history. Sharon Lawler has down a fabulous job. I'm sure that she would be
