

# A Note from the CEO -

#### **Fall Lecture & Workshop**

I hope you were able to attend this very special lecture. The workshop taught the next day was well worth it for someone who doesn't do hand piecing, like me. Ms. Quinn was a wonderful teacher.

#### Refreshments / Pot Luck

I heard a couple of comments regarding how light the refreshment table was at the Day Chapter meeting this month. Well... you have to bring something, if you want to have refreshments. While you are not required to bring refreshments, please support your Hospitality chairmen when they make a request.

#### Historian

Do you like to take pictures? Are you an organized person? Those are about the only requirements to be Guild Historian. This is an incredibly important position this year because we don't want to miss documenting our quilt show. Fair Warning: I'm going to start calling people again to find a volunteer. Be Ready!

#### **Bare Bones Retreat**

There has been an amazing lack of response for the Bare Bones Retreat this year. Last year it was very hard to get enough attendees, but they were finally able to fill the retreat by opening the attendance up to outside members. We tried that this year, but so far we haven't had any success. As I write this note, we have only 8 people signed up to go — and we are past the point of cancelling the event. By my estimations, the Guild will probably lose between \$1,500 and \$2,000 on this event. This is most likely the last year for the Bare Bones Retreat. The Executive Board will be doing a post mortem evaluation at their October meeting and the decision to continue or discontinue this event will be made at that time.

#### **Executive Board Meetings**

Attendance at Executive Board meetings is required of all elected Board members, Chapter presidents, and chairs of Standing Committees. If you are unable to attend a meeting, please contact me and send an appropriate substitute to present your report to the board. #### Follow-up - Froncie Quinn Lecture and Workshop

Our Fall Lecture and Workshop series was quite successful this year. We had over 70 Guild members attend the lecture on Florence Peto, a quilt historian and Quilter's Hall of Fame inductee. Froncie Quinn was quite engaging as she assumed the role of Ms. Peto, reading excerpts from Peto's writings.

The workshop the next day was full. We had 20 members with Dawn Heese and Bettina Havig helping me with the class. The workshop focused on hand piecing and hand applique. Froncie showed us her techniques for ensuring that the points on flying geese come out sharp every time.

This year's budget had allocated \$1,100 in expenses for this event based upon sharing travel costs with another guild in Missouri. Unfortunately, that guild cancelled out of their contract. Thankfully, Froncie worked with us to keep her airfare costs low and Bettina opened her home so that we didn't have to pay hotel expenses.

In addition, the Executive Board voted to adjust the cost of the workshop from the \$55 per person originally budgeted to \$45 per person. That change ensured that we had full attendance at the workshop. The speaker cost for the special lecture was \$400. The income we made from the workshop covered all other expenses.

I want to thank many of our Guild members as well as Froncie herself for their many kind acts of assistance during this time.

#### ENGLISH PAPER PIECING INTEREST GROUP

English Paper Piecing is a centuries old hand piecing technique in which fabric is basted around a paper shape and then those shapes are whip-stitched together to form a quilt block. Years ago it was necessary to trace and cut out your own paper shapes, but now there are companies from which you can purchase the pre-cut paper shapes. There is a variety of shapes and different sizes of hexagons, squares, triangles, diamonds, etc. which can be put together in a myriad of designs. I've even seen Apple Core and Dresden Plate shapes, which can be purchased. There are also paper shapes for use in appliqué.

I've enjoyed English Paper Piecing for several years. It's something that is very portable. Whenever traveling or waiting in a Doctor's office, etc., I take along a project to work on and in the evenings I stitch while watching TV. One tip, however, for when you are out in public and stitching away – people will always ask what you are doing and the answer to that question usually brings on several more questions. I love sharing my fondness for this technique, but there are times when I just want to sit quietly and stitch. At those time I put a set of earphones in my ears (the earphones aren't attached to anything; just tucked into my shirt). When people see the earphones they usually don't interrupt me, and I stitch away.

After all the hard work and furor of our quilt show, we have a special treat in store. Pat is going to teach us how to twill. This decorative embroidery stitch is great for wall-hangings, quilts, and all kinds of projects. Pat has designed several Christmas ornaments for us to work on to learn twilling. The supply list is small, inexpensive, and easy to transport. We anticipate a relaxing and fun time while learning a new skill.

Supply List: small embroidery hoop, 7 inches or larger, any size you can handle; fabric to embroider on, must fit in your hoop (good to bring a piece to practice on and another for the project—can bring a variety of fabrics and threads to play with); #5 embroidery needle; #5 DMC Pearl Cotton (comes in a skein, can be found at Hobby Lobby or Michaels and some quilt shops); basic sewing kit (scissors, thimble—if you use one, pencil or marking pen).

The project on which we will be learning the twilling stitch will be a Christmas ornament, so you want a solid, white on white, cream on cream, or color of your choice; but remember, you want the thread to show well on your fabric.
