#### What's all the buzz about????

An important part of the guild activities are the interest groups. Some guilds call these groups "bees" but whatever they are called they help participants get better acquainted, perhaps focus on a special technique and foster an exchange of information. If you don't belong, think about joining or forming one. Check out the list of current groups in the Calendar each month. There's always a contact person listed so it's a good idea to call first to verify location, etc. If a group is listed in the Calendar, that indicates that it is open to any member of the guild.

The October Starlight meeting program will focus on the interest groups. Each group will have a chance to explain a bit about the activities of the group and share the results of their work. Some groups meet for only a limited time... like the current Jane Austen group. Others have been ongoing for quite a while. Your attendance is not mandatory just as with any guild activity and you can belong to more than one group.

October's Starlight meeting will offer an opportunity to propose a new group or to start a second group of some interest that is already represented. All it takes is someone to take the lead, act as the contact person and shepherd the group along a bit until it's formed. Consider your personal interest and whether there is a current group that meets your needs. If not, then plan to step up to explain the group you would like to see formed, be prepared to have a sign up sheet with a time and place in mind. What seems to work best is to meet the first time in someone's home pending a decision on what day and time the group will meet.

Some suggestions for new groups might be a daytime 30s group, Miniatures, Doll quilts, Star quilt patterns, an evening Charm group, or a monthly lunch and quilt shop trip outside of Columbia... (when this one was suggested in conversation everyone was ready to join).




