

# Membership Booklet 2011-2012

The following Article was not included in the membership booklet for the 2011-2012 year.

# Article 7—Finance

Section 4: Chapters may hold fundraising events to supplement budget allocations. All funds raised remain with the chapter until the end of the fiscal year and may be used with the discretion of the chapter board. Chapters will not be required to hold fundraising activities. (added 6/09)

Section 5: Funds raised by an ad hoc committee for a specially designated project will revert to the general fund when the ad hoc committee completes its function. An ad hoc committee may be organized by either the Executive Board or by a chapter board. (added 6/09)

Add to the end of Article 10, Section 1: Changes shall immediately be published in the newsletter and incorporated in subsequent membership booklets. (6/09)

Regular meetings of the Guild are held on the first Monday of the month at 1:00 pm and the first Thursday of the month at 7:00 pm at the Fairview United Methodist Church, 3200 Chapel Hill Rd., Columbia, Missouri.

Annual dues are \$30 for the fiscal year of July 1 to June 30.

Bettina's interests in quilting include determining the age of a quilt for historical purposes.

Teaching is Bettina's love. Over the years she has taken the time to write and illustrate seven books related to quilting and to be included in several quilting magazines. She is constantly dreaming up innovative ideas for workshops that we in this Guild are very fortunate to have at our doorstep and she takes elsewhere to spread her enthusiasm for this craft.

Stephens College has been at the center of their family with her husband, Alan, teaching American History there for 39 years. He currently acts as the College's Archivist. Their daughter, Kristen lives in Tulsa currently employed as an Assistant Professor at Oklahoma University. Kristen received her doctorate from MU in Social Work in 2010.
