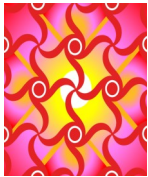

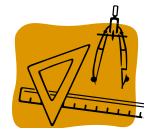

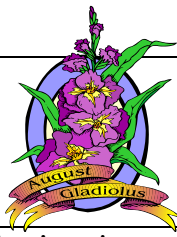
**Day Chapter Exchange Block Winner—Cindy Bryan**

I was the lucky winner of the July Exchange blocks. A simple nine patch with 30s fabric that I will use for a charity quilt is what I have planned. I will provide the fabric, but you can add your own 30's if you want.

I have been quilting over 20 years, starting with an Adult Education class that Rosalia Meyer taught. Currently, my goal is to get about 10 quilt tops done and basted, ready for the hand quilting that I love. Unlike most of you, I'm not looking at retirement, but rather full-time employment as soon as my daughter graduates next year. I have a daughter and 2 sons that are now almost out of the house. My daughter has taken the most interest in quilting. Walking by a quilt I had laid out on the floor, she asked "Who is that for?". When I replied, "Will", she said "No", I want it. My goal is to have at least 3 quilts made for each of the kids.

Most of the quilts I have been making are in the autumn, early American look with a modern twist. However, the one I just pieced was very much on the pink side. Looking forward to making this quilt for True North or another charity for women and children. Thank you for making this possible.

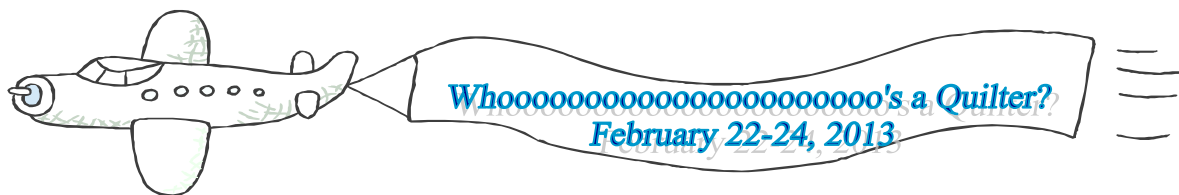

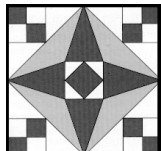

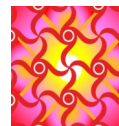

This quilt features 9 different blocks: Nine Patch, Railroad Crossing, Card Trick, Sawtooth Star, Friendship Star, Churn Dash, Double Pinwheel, Cake Stand, and King's Crown. All blocks finish at 8-1/2" square.

Shortly after Candy retired a friend hooked her up with Jo Morton to design and make her free-to-use patterns for Andover Fabrics. Candy has designed and made over 20 quilts for the Andover website, starting with Jo's Hattiesburg line. She has also designed and made 2 projects for Fons and Porter magazines using Jo's Lucinda lines. Jo also published two of her designs in her book "Vintage Journey".



• Participants will receive the pattern, have fun, improve piecing accuracy, learn a new technique or discover a new tool and make some traditional quilt blocks.

• Participants need to bring: Sewing machine, 4 coordinating fat quarters—1 dark, 1 medium, 1 light, 1 other, rotary cutting supplies (cutter and mat), pins, 4 or 6" square ruler (for squaring up), coordinating thread, scissors, your favorite gadget or tool (for discussion).

This workshop is limited to 20 participants.
