

Happy New Year to everyone and best wishes for a wonderful 2013!

I am pleased to report that the By-Laws Ad Hoc Committee formed last summer has been working productively and at its December meeting, Board members began their work of critiquing and polishing the policies, procedures and by-laws. Remember: you are invited to attend monthly Board meetings to hear and learn how your guild works.

Our policies and procedures needed to be updated in a number of spots where wording had become distorted and some sentences had lost meaning. This happens as documents are changed, updated, and passed among many editors. It is also important that our policies and procedures accurately reflect the > various activities and interests of the guild. For instance, the type and number of retreats held each year can be a guild decision based on participation, not a requirement. Or, if a majority of the members lose interest in an activity, then the activity can be made optional or part of an interest group. An example is the Exchange Blocks: members are more interested in making blocks than receiving them.

Our organizational structure, 3 boards and a number of committee chairs, is becoming more difficult to sustain each year. I can't tell you how

many "no's" our nominating committee received earlier this year. Remember how close we came to the shut-down of our Starlight chapter for lack of officers? The By-Laws Ad Hoc Committee and the Board are working to develop a different structure that will reduce the number of meetings required to operate the guild and to increase opportunities for members to actively participate in current and long term guild operations. To do all this requires a number of changes to the guild by-laws; these changes will be presented to the guild membership for review and final approval. If the proposed by-laws are approved, the policies and procedures will be rechecked by the By-Laws Ad Hoc Committee to verify consistency.

Each member is asked to read the materials provided in the Members section of the BTQG website. If you don't have access to the website, please contact Bettina Havig or me and we will get a paper copy to you. Also, please send questions or comments in writing to either of us and we'll get answers for you.

And one more time: Happy New Year!

Fabric Poinsettia Bowls

Did you purchase one of the fabric poinsettia bowls used as centerpieces at the Day Chapter Christmas luncheon? We used a moldable nonwoven double sided fusible product, Inn-Spire Plus, between the fabric layers. As Carol Tummons said, the bowl can be ironed flat for storage.

Here are the instructions from the product package: Inn-Spire can be softened any number of ways: hair dryer, heat gun with a steamer or your iron. Either way, you don't need any more than a few seconds of heat to soften the Inn-spire sufficiently for molding. You need only warm the material to the point it becomes flexible enough for your project. For most project 15-20 seconds on your lowest iron setting will softer the Inn-Spire effectively.

If you'd like to try making a bowl yourself, the pattern (plus others using the same product) and Inn-Spire Plus are available at one of our local quilt stores, Satin Stitches.

And if you meant to purchase a poinsettia bowl but got distracted, we have two left. They're \$10 each. Call Margaret Heller at 446-1942 to reserve yours today.

A big thank you to Karen Huggler, Robin Heider, and Hank Botts who cheerfully agreed to make these poinsettia bowls with me!
