### Rekindling Vintage Quilt Blocks by Shelly Pagliai

The Starlight May program will be presented by Shelly Pagliai of Prairie Moon Quilts, Macon, Mo. She will be showcasing her new series of patterns that focus on vintage items that have been made into quilts, and vintage designs that have been updated with today's techniques and materials. She will show how to use orphan blocks, abandoned quilt tops, or rescued linens, and turn them into tomorrow's heirlooms. Shelly will have examples, tell stories and give ideas for how you can use rescued or vintage textiles to make quilts or other projects.

Shelly credits her maternal grandmother, Mildred, for getting her started down the road of quilting obsession, by enrolling her in 4-H sewing classes at the age of 8. When Shelly's Great-Aunt Charlotte presented her with a garbage bag of scraps a few years later, she found her passion there among the fabric pieces.

By 1985 she had found her quilting niche in the needleturn method of hand appliqué, but that didn't stop her from trying other techniques. In fact, by 1996 she was teaching classes ranging from hand piecing and appliqué to quilt design. Those classes would carry over to her shop, Prairie Moon Quilts, where she began to sell her own patterns and kits in 1999.

With the launch of her web site and blog in 2008, Shelly has explored even more opportunities for spreading the quilting word. In 2009, she purchased a longarm quilting machine, and has been doing professional machine quilting for customers and other designers ever since. Her work can be seen in several popular magazines, in shows and other venues, as well as online.

When she's not teaching class, she is selling her designs, operating the longarm, running her charity "Necktie Social", or designing her own award-winning, nationally exhibited quilts, Shelly can be found spending time with her favorite cowboy and all their many animals on their Missouri ranch.
