Our speaker for the April meeting of the Starlight Piecmakers is Lynne D. Taylor, winner of the Benartex Best Miniature Quilt award at Paducah (AQS) in 2011. Lynne will be bringing a trunk show of some of her prize winning miniature and larger sized quilts. Lynne is considered a master quilter. She began quilting over 25 years ago as a student earning her master's degree in art at Southeast Missouri State University. To complete her master's degree, she chose to do a project rather than a research paper.

"I've always sewn, but I didn't want to make clothing because you put all that effort into it and it goes out of style," Taylor said. "Quilts never go out of style, so I thought I'd try making quilted pictures for the wall. I did four wall hangings to finish up my master's degree, so that's what got me going on the quilting"\*

Missing five chapter meetings in these last three months has hampered the sharing of information about the quilt show progress. Therefore, the May 2014 quilt show has been canceled. The Board discussed pros and cons, but they voted at their regular Board meeting on March 10 to cancel the May quilt show. The advertising for the 2014 quilt show up to now had been at no cost, but we were at a point in time to begin massive and costly advertisement. Discussion also included re-scheduling it for November, but that was feared to be too soon to assure that enough guild members would volunteer for the many aspects needed to produce a quality quilt show.

In the meantime, please 1) continue to produce tops and get them ready for a future quilt show, 2) continue to make Market Place items and store them back, and 3) continue to work on Challenge Projects with the fabric and theme from Carrol Lewis. Many items will be needed for fund raising events, whether during the next quilt show or during a BTQG live auction event or during a BTQG booth at an area bazaar or two. For any of these fund raising ideas to move forward, massive membership involvement is necessary.

We realize that many of you, both individually and as small groups, made beautiful items for the Silent Auction and for the Market Place. The Quilt Show chairperson and all of the other Board members thank you for that contribution. Please keep these for a future event or quilt show; but the consensus of the Board is that there just is not enough time left before May to confirm that the quilt show would have its 1) usual number of great quilts for display, 2) items enough for adequate fund raising at a Silent Auction and in the Market Place sales room, and 3) volunteers enough to do all steps needed before, during, and after a quilt show.

Fairview United Methodist Church graciously allowed cancellation of the dates in May at no charge to the guild. Ads that had been submitted to start soon have been canceled, also at no cost to the guild. Sincerely,

## "AND NOW A WORD FROM YOUR CEO"

The Board made a tough decision in cancelling the quilt show that was scheduled for May, but we felt it prudent to conserve guild money and to maintain our guild's tradition of a quality quilt show. Keep finishing your quilts and your Market Place projects in anticipation of a quilt show date. See an explanation elsewhere in this newsletter about the cancellation.

We will continue to post Board minutes on the website and keep a few copies at the Membership table for guild members to read. However, the Board voted to wait a full month before posting the minutes because they do not become the official and final record of Board action until we meet that next month and either approve them or approve them with corrections. This is the practice of many (or most) organizations, such as the board of education for school districts. After April's Board meeting, you will see the official and final copy of the March Board minutes on the guild's web site and on the Membership table during chapter meetings. After May's Board meeting, you will see the April minutes. So on and so forth.

The Board talked about a possible quilt auction or a garage sale during their March meeting. We will continue discussions at April's Board meeting. You are welcome to share ideas with a Board member.

Basic sewing supplies needed: machine, cotton thread, rotary cutter, and 6 fat quarters. If you have a personal iron/mat, that would be great. The pattern will be provided. We will have a large cutting mat, but if you have a small one and ruler to bring, that may be more convenient for you.

For this workshop, you can pay the day of the workshop, but we need to know how much table space we need, so please e-mail me at austinb@missouri.edu and let me know that you plan to attend. I

think this will be a fun class. I have included a picture of some of their miniature guilts for you to see.

We have our Annual meeting in June, so we will not have a Chapter meeting in June. Our July program is multi-generational quilting. We will have more on this in the June Newsletter, but please plan to show quilts you have helped a child make. The child is welcome to attend and share their experience of learning quilting. Sharing and teaching quilting to the next generation is a way for us to promote quilting in the future.
