Donna Baker has shared the recipe for the great biscuits she brought to the Day Chapter Salad Luncheon in July -





Ingredients:

Directions

- 1. Cut the sour cream into the biscuit mix (Bisquick) or any pancake mix, then add the 7-Up, or Ginger Ale, or Sierra Mist.
- 2. Instead of flour, use additional biscuit mix to sprinkle on a board. Pat dough out (it will be soft) and cut into biscuits. I use a glass to cut them.
- 3. Melt butter in a 9-in square pan, then place biscuits on top and bake at 350 degrees for 12-15 mins or until perfectly golden. For the July meeting, I made 1 ½ times the recipe and cut smaller muffins.



Explore the endless options of quilts made essentially from right angle triangles. By participating in an optional exchange of fabrics to expand you scrap collection even quilters with a small stash can make a quilt with up to two hundred fabrics. Cutting and piecing are simple and the design options are both exciting and mesmerizing. Students will receive three patterns for table runners using the blocks they make in class.

Supplies:

- 8-10 fabrics, 1/4 yd each in assortment of light, medium and dark.
 You may be sharing and trading fabrics. Use good quality and please pre wash.
- 1/2 yard of fabrics to set your project...a small quilt or table runner.
 This is also background fabric.
- thread in mid tones of gray, neutral, or tan
- basic sewing supplies, including fine straight pins and a seam ripper
- rotary cutter, mat and gridded ruler---a 12x6 inch is the most useful.
- sewing machine in good working order, extra wound bobbins, extension cord and adaptor if necessary. Bring your machine instruction manual.
- Optional: flannel or fleece to use as design surface.
- Optional: small iron and pad

Before class divide your 1/4 yards in half to make two pieces that are approximately 9 inches x 22 inches, carefully cut one of the sections of each of your fabrics into 2 7/8"x 22" lengthwise strips. Be accurate. Reserve the other portion of each 1/4 yard. There is no need to bring any more fabric than requested on the supply list.


