for purchase. Elinor will also present a trunk show of some beautiful quilts from her antique quilt collection. I am truly looking forward to her lecture!

Expert tips for careful cutting of fabric, Myra Harder's advice is: "Always cut the largest pieces of fabric in a project first. This is the most efficient way to cut fabric. Also, you will know right away if you are short on a fabric rather than discovering this little surprise at the end of your project."

Elizabeth Tisinger's advice is: "I like to rotary-cut several layers of fabric at a time. To prepare a stack for cutting, I steam-press one fabric, place the second fabric on top of it, and press again, repeating until I've stacked as many fabrics as I feel comfortable cutting at once. Ironing the fabrics together with steam makes them kind of cling to each other, resulting in more precise pieces".

Such good advice! Don't forget to bring along your completed tops and quilts for Show & Tell....After the retreat, you should have LOTS to show!

See you all at the April meeting and don't forget that time and talent make up a productive guild. Please consider volunteering for a position on the board.

Because of the changing of the guard in June, we request that all library items be returned no later than the May meetings so our audit can be as complete as possible.


And, last but not least, we can no longer accept your generous donations of books and magazines and I will have more information for you at the April meetings.

Waterfall Paper Piecing Workshop With May Gunter

Monday, May 4, 2015 9:00 am to 12:00 noon

May's interest in paper piecing began with a workshop in Minnesota in 2010. The workshop presented a method of paper piecing that Judy Niemeyer had developed. If you are new to paper piecing or would like to try a different method this would be the workshop for you. May loved the organization and step by step instructions presented with this technique. She discovered that the guess work was eliminated and everything fit together! Her greatest joy is to share the skills and methods she has polished for herself over the years.

Waterfall Paper Piecing Workshop Supply List

Church will open at 8:30 for pre-set-up with instructions to begin at 9:00 pm.

Pattern and fabric—Waterfalls pattern available, \$16, at workshop and includes foundation paper Sewing Machine and Accessories-need an open toe foot

Fabrics can be as little as 4 strips 2.5 x 42 inches in 2 different colors

Iron and Ironing Board – might be provided

One piece of Template Plastic (3" by 12" piece or 3" by 18")

12"" Add-a-quarter ruler (you must have this) the 6" ruler is to short

6 x12" ruler or 4.5 x 14" ruler for trimming

Medium size cutting mat Rotary cutter 45mm or 60 mm

New rotary blade

Scissors

Seam ripper

Scotch Tape (will be provided)

Paper and pen to take notes

Fabric Glue UHU stic (washable glue stick0

Glue Pen (Fons and Porter, Sewline or Avery)

Size 70/10 needles

High quality cotton sewing thread

Paper clips or binder clips

Gallon Baggies

Pencil

Power strips would be helpful
