
For our September meeting, Jackie Berry will be presenting a trunk show of her beautiful art quilts based on her own photography.

#### **Basic Quilting Interest Group**

The Basic Quilting Interest Group is for any guild member who wants to learn more about the basics of quilting techniques to enhance the accuracy, beauty, and durability of her quilting. It's also to improve her efficiency and increase her pleasure in cutting, measuring, sewing, pressing, and trimming blocks, sashing, borders, and binding. We currently meet once a month at my home either the third or fourth Wednesday morning of the month from 9 a.m. - noon. It is an informal group. I suggest a topic for the next session; members work on a sample using one of my machines (or bring their own portable one) and/or we discuss questions brought up by members related to a project any of them are working on. There is sharing of experience, knowledge of resources, ideas by members. We can bring in other experienced members to explain and demonstrate how to do some technique as the group desires. So far, usually 3-4 members attend. If we reach our maximum of 8 (which has to do with space and time to address each person's questions), we will seek a Guild member who is willing to form an additional group of this nature. # **2014 Quilt Show Entry Form Memories from the Past, Visions for the Future**

In order to get the program, map insert, and lay-out done in a timely manner, and accurately, our deadline this year is **October 24th (if mailed October 21st)**. SO..... **Start** planning your entries. You must be a paid member to enter a quilt or sponsor a quilt. No quilt may be entered that has been in a BTQG show in the last five years, unless it was voted "Viewer's Choice" in the previous show.

Again this year we **STRONGLY ENCOURAGE** you to type your entry directly into the form on the internet. This will make it much easier to do the labels. It also saves the guild money for printing costs. For those who sincerely shudder and shake at the thought of using the internet, we will be happy to accept the hand-written forms. For anyone who is submitting entries by hand, you will also need to fill in your claim check, except the areas marked "to be assigned". If you do on-line, the computer will fill in the claim check for you. It is quick and easy to do.

**TO DO ON-LINE REGISTRATION**, you need to know the information from the registration form, especially width and height (IN INCHES).


- 1. Go to the BTQG website (http://btqg.missouri.org) and click on For Entry Forms Click Here.
- 2. On the next page select Click here to enter your quilt online.
- 3. Read the directions at the top, BUT basically you just click on each entry with your mouse and type. **Be sure you pull down the arrow that says type of entry** in order to choose Challenge, Friendship, Wall hanging, Decorative, etc. EASY.
- 4. When finished, hit "Submit Quilt."
- 5. Double check your typing for accuracy.
- 6. If okay, hit "submit my entry." If not, go back and make corrections.
- 7. Print your claim check and label (all filled out for you) before proceeding.
- 8. Then either click on "Submit another quilt," or hit the red X in the upper right hand corner to close windows.

Note: If you choose "wearable" OR "decorative," identify the item by "decorative type," so that we can make arrangements to exhibit it properly. Then fill in approximate size. Again, there are categories for "challenge quilt" and "education." So if you participated in the challenge or made a quilt or other item in a BTQG sponsored class or in a class taught at a retreat, we would like to display those.

If you do not want to use the online entry form to enter your quilt, forms will be available at the September and October meetings. The form can also be printed from the BTQG website. I will be at the September and October meetings to answer any questions. If you already know and have finished some of your entries, please submit the forms early.
