Our guest speaker Marilyn Smith will bring us a trunk show of her amazing work. Marilyn began quilting in 2005 when she took a Sharon Rexroad Pineapple Lone Star Quilt class at a local quilt shop. She finished that quilt in 2006. She wanted to put cornerstones on that quilt so she borrowed her quilting friend's books and magazines for ideas. She was astounded at what she saw in this new world of quilting. This insatiable interest in quilting led her to the Columbia library where she checked out nearly every quilting book on their shelves. She made some family quilts and started collecting her own books. She fell in love with Karen K. Stone's book and chose a quilt pattern to make. She made some changes to it and worked on it for almost 2 years. This quilt, "JOY" would go on to win first place in Bed Quilts/Appliqué at Paducah and Honorable Mention at Dallas. "JOY" would grace the front of "Quilter's Newsletter" magazine and appear on the 2009 AQS (August) and IQA calendars.

Since then she has continued to make quilts for competition as well as for family. "4 Birds" won a second place award at AQS Grand Rapids in 2013 and she had two additional awards in the National Quilt Museum's New Quilts For An Old Favorite Contest.

Marilyn continues to explore techniques and recently completed her latest quilt, "Weighed in the Balance", consisting of 532 individual motifs, each different, each hand cut with scissors without marking or patterns. This quilt was exhibited at AQS competition in Paducah, and Dallas in 2015.

She is currently working on a quilt for her granddaughter. Marilyn has two adult children and six grandchildren. She teaches the Older Adult Sunday School Class at her church and is involved in the Hatton Community. She has been a member of the Booneslick Trail Quilter's Guild in the past and hopes to return as a member.....as soon as she can carve out the time to do so!



Birds in the Air, 12" finished block



Finished size 12 inches.

Cut 12 2 7/8" squares of assorted medium to dark prints. Subcut once on the diagonal for a total of 24 triangles. (A)

Cut 6 2 7/8" squares of assorted light prints. Subcut once on the diagonal for a total of 12 triangles. (A)

Cut 2 6 7/8" squares of background fabric. Subcut once on the diagonal for four triangles. (B) (If you want all four B triangles to be different fabrics then cut four squares.)
