Jean Brueggenjohann will present this program. She is a graphic designer, typographer, printer and fiber artist. She spent many years in the graphic design industry creating books, posters and brochures and has been teaching at the college level for 35 years. Almost 25 years ago she made her first quilt block. She started making quilts and slowly discovered surface design and studio art quilts. While she is still intrigued by the dynamics and geometry of traditional quilting and she continues to work in that area, she has become more and more involved with studio art quilts. This area has allowed her to experiment with color, illustration and pattern. Jean's latest body of work is illustrative. She uses drawing and tries to push the limits of color and design. She also tries to incorporate traditional quilting elements wherever she can. Jean will showcase quilts that got her where she is now and describe the process of how she creates modern art quilts from concept to the finished, embellished quilt. Jean has won many awards and has had quilts published in magazines and books. She really enjoys working within the intersection of traditional quilting and studio art quilts.

Once again I want to reinforce, if you don't do art quilts and you don't think you would be interested in art quilts that is even more reason to attend this program. You gain so much creativity when you are presented with a different perspective. Our attendance is up and that is fantastic. I love seeing those chairs fill up. The October Day chapter meeting will be the last meeting for the FAT QUARTER sales.

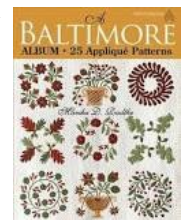

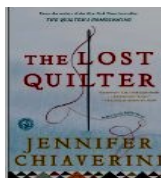
BTQG 30th ANNUAL RETREAT

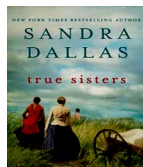


**Bonne Femme Book Group will meet October 20 at 1 p.m.

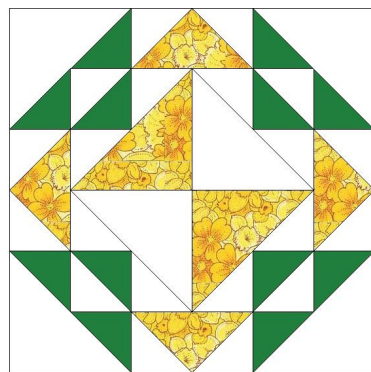
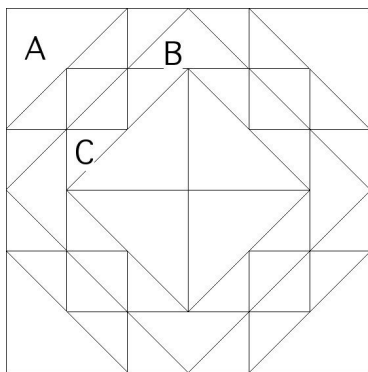
- ◆ To preserve all quilt making heritage and traditions;

Booneslick Trail Quilt Guild was founded in 1978.

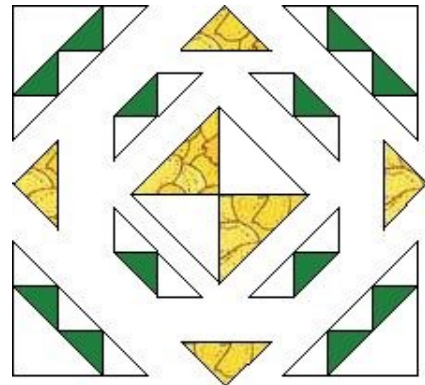


Corn and Beans Block November Block

Please sign your name in a seam allowance and turn the block(s) in at the November chapter meetings. The drawing will be at the Starlight meeting in November.



Finished size is 12 inches



sections for piecing

Use at least three fabrics, background plus two.

Rotary cutting instructions.

- A cut 3 $4 \frac{7}{8}$ " squares from background and one from fabric #1; subcut once on the diagonal.
- B cut one $5 \frac{1}{4}$ " square fabric #1. And subcut along both diagonals for four triangles.
- C six $2 \frac{7}{8}$ " squares fabric #2 and 10 $2 \frac{7}{8}$ " squares from background. Subcut once for a total of 20 background and 12 fabric #2 triangles.

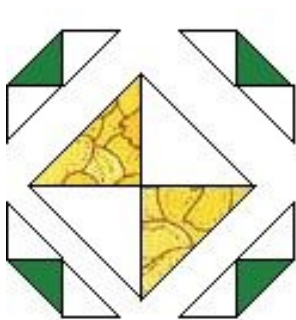
