
I hope Mary Honas' July presentation has inspired you to evaluate your UFO situation. Whether you use her definition of a UFO – any unfinished project - or mine - one started but not worked on for 6 months (or more), most of us have at least a few. (Lynn Hill says she has more UFOs than Roswell, NM!) Some of you aren't bothered by unfinished items, but the rest of us may have a bit of guilt about that stash. If so, take some time before our August meeting to inventory your collection and pick one or more to bring to the meeting. Bring your machine, or just handwork, if you'd rather. If you've been meaning to do labels for your quilts, now's the time. Or maybe one just needs binding. Or perhaps you have no idea what to do with a project that just isn't right. Some of your quilting sisters might have an idea or two for you, or the encouragement to just let it go. If you'd like to give some away, bring them. We can set up a "free to a good home" table or you can try to swap with someone. If no one is up to your project, the service project committee might be willing to take it off your hands (no promises, though). And if your UFOs include a different form of needlework that has been abandoned for guilting, you're welcome to bring that in, too. Let this meeting be the nudge (or kick in the pants) you need to get a hovering UFO out of orbit and into the finished category. Doors will open at 5. Bring a sack supper and beverage from home or your favorite drive-through. If the cookie fairy is reading this, perhaps she can call me and we can work out some sweet incentives for the evening. We met a lovely German couple who reminded us a lot of Barb Sanders and Nancy Antonio!




A display at the German School Museum. We learned a lot about the history of Hermann and the lives of the people who settled there. We were happy to see the quilts.
