The quilt top may be designed entirely of wool or only a portion of the top can include wool (for example, wool applique on cotton). TIME TO GET YOUR ENTRIES REGISTERED. Just go to dbrl.org, scroll down and click on Dawn Heese's new Manor House quilt. AND this year I am opening the exhibit to include HOOKED RUGS and WOVEN WOOL COVERLETS. Be sure your items have a 3" sleeve for hanging.

Submissions are being accept now through March 3, 2019. The show is being displayed from April 18 to May 13.

Hand Quilting Workshop

THE FINE ART OF HAND QUILTING

This sampler of quilting designs in a 15 inch pillow top is designed to sharpen your quilting skills, achieve a smaller more even stitch and help you develop good quilting techniques. A pattern for the sampler will be provided and students will use several different marking techniques. Class discussion will include information about batting selection, threads and needles.



Quilt Label

Supplies:

- ⇒ Muslin, bleached or unbleached
- ⇒ Printed label copy or drawn label
- ⇒ 8 1/2 x 11 piece of freezer paper (or the wrapper from a ream of paper)
- ⇒ Crayons or permanent markers
- ⇒ Inkjet printer
- ⇒ Masking tape



- 1. Fuse the freezer paper to a piece of muslin cut to match size, avoid dangling threads.
- 2. Using your inkjet printer, copy the label on the muslin. Peel muslin away from freezer paper (the freezer paper can be re-used several times)
- 3. Mount the label on masking tape to stabilize.
- 4. Color the label as desired (use on sheet from a lint roller, if available)
- 5. Heat set label. If colored with crayon, slip wax paper over the label to heat set, protect the iron's soleplate with a sheet of paper or paper towel.

Getting to Know Our Members

A new little segment for our newsletter from time to time will be The Quilter's Interview for various new and renewing members. Thank you, Bettina, for providing our list of questions.

Our spotlight member this month is Louise Bequette. Louise was nominated for the series. The person nominating Louise suggested her because "She quilts every day, always with several projects at a time. Louise is a talented, smart, multi-faceted woman and well worth an interview!"

What attracted you to quilting? I grew up with quilts and comforters that my paternal great grandmother had made plus a Tumbling Block crib quilt made by my maternal grandmother.

When did you start to make quilts? Did you take Classes? Where? I made my first quilt from a top made in the early 40s by a deceased neighbor and had it ready to quilt when JFK died; and quilted and watched the funeral on TV. The second quilt before 1964 when my husband bought home the wooden style of quilting frame. Finished it and burned the frame, as I was never going to quilt another one. Just continued to sew, though.

Were you a seamstress before you got interest in quilts? I started sewing when I was 9 and was taught by my mother in 4-H classes. I never really stopped sewing, but just make quilts now.

Did your mother, grandmother, or aunts make quilts? If so, did you learn quilt making from them? I did not learn to quilt from my family members, although several did.

What is your favorite type of quilt? What part of quilt making do you like most? My favorite type of quilt is what I am making at the time. Tend to be scrappy now as I am trying to clean up the bits and pieces before I move. Far too many UFOs too. I have one hand-pieced and hand-quilted quilt to finish but any other quilts will be machine quilted. I prefer using templates, mostly Marti Michell's, but some others as well as using rulers.

What do you do with most of the quilts you make? Quilts go in the stacks or walls, or to family or as gifts to others, or given to charities.

Do you prefer to make bed quilts or smaller quilts like wall hangings and decorate items? I have made many sizes but prefer smaller quilts now, but I do have some twin-sized ones to finish.

If you relocated to another town or city would you look for a guild to join? Or would you quit quilting? I probably would look for a group since I have been a guild member since the 80s after seeing the seminars set up by Bettina in the early 80s. At the least, I would continue to read the history and technique books and finish the UFOs.
