Special Speaker and Workshops

Have you heard of the modern quilt guild? Mark your calendars for Friday, September 27 at 7:00 pm. Kristi Daum the founder and past president of the St. Louis Modern Quilt Guild will share her love of quilting with us and how she embraced the modern quilting movement. Many of the quilts she will share with us have been featured in magazines, and in quilt shows throughout the country and around the world.



Saturday September 28 Kristi will be giving two half day workshops.

"Tipsy Triangles" takes on a seemingly simple block to create lots of excitement as you build interchangeable pieces. This is a great way to turn a ho-hum block into something more magical. You will learn how to make the tipsy triangle block and walk away with enough blocks to make a baby sized quilt and the knowledge to build a bigger quilt using modern layouts.

The "Bag it up Improv" workshop is a great way to create unique blocks and/or a quilt top using improvisational techniques that many quilters usually shy away from. Students will learn that sometimes adding a little structured chaos into your life is a good thing.

Maximum for each workshop is 20 people and cost is \$35. Registration forms will be in the August newsletter.




