
Don't forget to register for the Winter Retreat. If you've lost your registration form, go to the BTQG website and download the September newsletter.

Here's what I will do:

Decide on the center medallion for your quilt. Think about fabric choices. Come prepared to discuss options with everyone to help build a successful quilt. Endeavor to complete a frame/ border between meetings.

I love medallion quilts and you may have noticed that the format has gotten very popular especially on the web. I suggest you look at photos of medallion quilts to generate creative ideas.

I can only accommodate a total of eight people. I am sorry that I don't have room for people to sew here so the actual sewing will be done at home.
