

Daylight Chapter Hawaiian Quilt Makers

Are you ready for a little getaway to the Hawaiian islands? Well, the Monday, April 1, meeting is your chance when the Hawaiian Quilt Makers visit the Booneslick Trails Quilt Guild.

The following is a brief biography of the quartet, written by Dianne Harmon:

"We are Dinah Nash, Dianne Harmon, Nancy Williamson and Kathi Hoeltge. Nancy, Dinah and Dianne are sisters, and Kathi is our adopted sister and willing accomplice!

"We sisters are Air Force brats and our grandmother lived with us. She taught us how to sew, crochet, knit, tat, embroider and anything else she could think of to keep us busy while our parents worked. Kathi worked with Dinah and was drawn in to our addiction. "Between us there are 11 children, 25 grandchildren and 14 greats! We live in Raymore, and Kathi is not far away.

"Like most quilters we learned to sew at an early age making clothes. We developed a quilting interest around 25 years ago and learned a lot of techniques through our local shop's block of the month classes. "It soon became clear that we had more quilts to quilt than income would allow and the spark was lit! "Dinah and Dianne are long-armers, and Nancy and Kathi are the inspiration with their piecing and embroidery embellishments.

"Quilting has been a creative outlet for all of us. We have learned new joys, seen amazing and talented quilting artists and met many new friends. "As Gram always taught us—busy hands are happy hands!

Starlight Piecemakers Lori Lee Triplett

Lori Lee Triplett, business manager of Quilt and Textile Collections, will be presenting "Africa's Gift to the World" on Thursday, April 4, at the BTQG's Starlight Chapter's meeting.

Lori Lee has combined a variety of passions which include research, writing and performing in the quilt world. As a lecturer and instructor, she brings her experience from stage, screen and radio for her educational presentations. She also presents at national conferences and has made appearances internationally. As an art quilter, she prefers to work with hand dyed or hand painted fabrics.

QTC manages of the Poos Collection, one of the largest privately held quilt and textile collections in the world. Its large collection of antique quilts emphasizes pre-1860 quilts. Some age-appropriate vintage fabric is also a part of the collection. The folk-art textiles are from around the world with a particular emphasis and variety of West African textiles such as adire indigo or ashoke/aso oke, kente and Ewe woven prestige cloths or garments.

QTC was formed in 2011 entirely to manage and share the Poos Collection. Kay Triplett, Lori Lee's sister, is the curator. Because many of the quilts and/or textiles are fragile and can't be displayed regularly, they are shared through books, presentations and special exhibitions.

The Poos Collection is named after Martha Poos, who quilted and instilled her love of quilting to Kay. Originally the collection was compiled from estate sales and small antique shops. However, as the collection has grown, the variety of sources for the collection has grown as well.

Lori has written more than 15 books and numerous

magazine articles. "Indigo Quilts," written with her sister, covers the history of indigo from Africa to America.

Please bring some zippers, fabric (quilted or not) to play with, zipper foot, and 301 handout with the accessories section. I will bring extras at cost of printing. I will demonstrate different zipper options, and feet options. I would like to have some volunteers to help with the demo some of the accessories. Please bring ideas and suggestions for accessory feet demos you would like to see.

I will have some boxes containing the seven (7) standard accessories for sale. The cost is \$20/box and includes zipper foot, rolled hemmer, gathering, edger, ruffler, hemmer, and binder for those who do not have them. 
Block Party

Winter Retreat Recap

We had 46 people attend the *Go Jump in the Lake* winter retreat at The Lodge of Four Seasons on February 17-19. Both the scrappy applique and the travel case classes were full, with approximately 20 participants each, and we saw lots of beautiful quilts being made over the weekend. From a financial perspective, we took in \$12,808 in income with expenses of \$12,479. We were able to keep cost increases to a minimal due to the guild's approval of a \$1000 expense budget, which went towards the group sewing room and the 200 power amp that kept our sewing machines going and our irons hot.

I'm pleased to share that next year's retreat chairs will be Deb Odor and Betty White.
