
CEO's Message





Special Interest Groups

Our Guild has several special interest groups (https://btqg.missouri.org/ interestgroups.htm) designed to help like-minded quilters and sewists get together. Check out the complete list on the Guild website.

Featherweight Friends is a group led by members to learn more about Singer 221 and 222 machines, including care, maintenance, accessories, and sewing. Members with 301 Singers are also welcome. We meet at Fairview UMC at 10 am (before Day Guild) when Chapter meetings are held in person.

Medallion Interest group's objective is to design and construct your own medallion quilt. In the process, the hope is that participants will gain confidence to tackle ideas one might think are beyond their skills. We enjoy the feedback and encouragement of everyone's input.

Needlework (formerly known as Redwork), covers all the hand stitching arts. Most of us do embroidery, but we include counted cross stitch, knitting, tatting, crochet, and anything else of interest to one or more members. Since we usually meet in members' homes, we limit our membership to a dozen. Our meetings are on the fourth Thursday at 1 p.m. January through October; we work on our own projects, with the occasional raffle quilt for the quilt show.

The **Sassy Stitchers** is a hand appliqué group. We use a sit-and-sew format for our group. We work on our individual projects which include needle turn appliqué and wool appliqué. We meet the second Thursday of each month (except December) usually in one of the meeting rooms at the library from 9:30 am to 11:30 am. We would love to have new members! Come join us!

SASH stands for Short Attention Span, Happy quilters. (Our founder, Sarah Briggs came up with that.) We don't have a particular focus but explore different ideas, techniques, and projects that we share with each other. Sometimes we try a group challenge. We visit and laugh and support each other. We meet on the 3rd Wednesday of each month at 2 pm.

The **Small Wonders** group was begun several years ago by a group of BTQG members who shared a love for miniature quilts. The group has expanded the 'small' description to include any quilt or project that is smaller than a bed-sized quilt. We are a diverse group whose show-and-tell each month always includes treasures we are working on. In addition to traditional and art quilts, projects include wool applique, embroidery, doll making, totes, and bags to name a few. It's always a fun and lively time each month to get together to share projects and tips, as well as the challenges we've encountered. We meet the second Wednesday of each month at 1:00 pm at Daniel Boone Regional Library.

White Christmas Pie

From: Janice Haralson

pie shell baked and cooled
envelope of plain gelatin
1/4 cup water
1/2 cup sugar
4 Tbsp. Flour
1/2 tsp. Salt
1/2 cup milk
3/4 tsp. Vanilla
1/4 tsp. Almond flavoring
1/2 cup whipping cream
1 cup coconut
1/3 cup finely chopped maraschino cherries

Place gelatin in a cup, soften with water and let set. Mix sugar, flour, and salt in a saucepan. Add milk and mix together. Heat and stir constantly until the mixture boils. Let boil for 1 minute (will burn on the bottom if not stirred). Remove from heat, add gelatin, and stir well. Let cool until partially set. When ready beat with a mixer until nice and smooth. Add vanilla and almond flavoring.

Beat whipping cream and add sugar until stiff. Fold whipped cream into gelatin mixture. Fold coconut and finely chopped maraschino cherries in carefully. Pour in the pie shell and chill for at least 2 or 3 hours.
