

# Happy Birthday

## Daylight Chapter Sew Day All Day Sewing Focus: Service Charity Quilts!

Come and bring a friend - we're meeting in person! Start 9:30 am (doors open @ 9:00 am) - room picked up and doors locked by 4:00 pm.

Connie Richards will have precut fabrics and instructions to enjoy sewing the whole day long. You may participate in whatever way you enjoy because everything you do will bring comfort and care to someone in need. *Please note: games and competitions are optional.* 

At 12 noon, we'll break for a "Baked Potato bar" lunch - the Guild is providing chili, baked potatoes, and toppings. Members may bring side dishes or desserts if desired. BYO water bottle, soda, coffee, etc.

Choose how you wish to participate:

Our jelly roll event will benefit *True North of Columbia*, which is a local comprehensive domestic and sexual violence victim service program. They ask for larger, bed-size quilts which bring comfort and warmth as recipients begin the healing process. Please join in with a group of four (4) friends to make a Jelly Roll quilt. If you don't have a group and want to join in, contact Sue Donnelly - we'll have a group for you! Plus it's a fun way to get to know other guild members.

#### Jelly Roll quilt competition

- use 2.5 inch strips as a basis of the pattern; the finished size should be 55" x 60 (twin size or larger).
- add something "different" so that the finished quilt is more than just 2.5 inch strips
- bring your own fabrics (everything precut but nothing sewn) OR get precut fabrics from Connie
- donate a jelly roll for someone else to sew

Each four-person group will need two sewing machines, one person to cut, and one to press. If you choose to applique it must be sewn on. Borders or setting triangles should be precut.

\*\*\* Quilt pressed very well when finished with basted stitch all around the outer edge.

Many prizes: 1. Jack Rabbit finished, 2. Super creative, 3. Best use of color (and maybe more)... Maybe even quilt as you go??

Make a Pillow Case - Linda Rexroth will help instruct in the morning if needed.

Self-binding baby blanket (Shabby Fabrics has great YouTube for teaching this)

Big Stitch quilting (by hand) at a table

**Help make kits** for charity - cutting and bagging fabrics. Connie will provide the pieces. **Sew kits** Winding Windmill blocks or Potato chip blocks. Connie will provide fabric/ pattern

You are special so there will be treats for YOU as well:

1. Foundation paper piecing pattern of our BTQG square block - You will receive the pattern free when you attend! Thank you to Janet Hollandsworth and Kim Diamond for figuring it out.

2. <u>Sawyer Creek</u> - Becky Wolpert's company- will bring handmade seam rippers and pressing tools for you to purchase in lots of pretty varieties.

3. <u>Jerry's Sharpening</u> of Mid-Missouri is going to be available to sharpen your scissors, snips, and knives!!! Bring your items early and he will have them ready for you that day. Good as new!

# Special Workshop of BTQG Members

Ready to add some traditional quilting décor to your home? If you are, the Booneslick Trail Quilters' Guild program committee has just the workshop for you. Jocelyn Wheeler, a Hickory County MU Extension employee, will present a **Barn Quilt Workshop** from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm Saturday, May 18.

Guild members, Laurie Matthews, Martha Eberhard, and Sarah Gist have taken this class before and really enjoyed it as well as the results of the class. There is a limit of 20 people for the BTQG workshop. There is a fee of \$30 per person. Additional costs will be for the material based on the size of the barn board you select. The price for a 1x1 ft. plywood board and all other supplies is \$25. The price for a 2x2 ft. barn board is \$50. Both sizes are suitable for indoor and outdoor displays.

Registration is limited to 20 people on a first-come, first-served basis. An email blast with complete information and the registration form will be sent to all members on Friday, March 1. Registration forms also will be available at both the March 4 and March 7 BTQG chapter meetings.
