and you want to do something else so you close it, it's a "failed" business. If you write a book or two, then decide that you don't actually want to keep doing that, you're a "failed" writer. Special showing of Korean wrapping quilt set for October meetings

BTQG members will be treated to a special viewing of a Korean wrapping quilt at both chapter meetings in October -- Monday, Oct. 2, at 1 p.m., and Thursday, Oct. 5, at 7 p.m. The occasion is the celebration of the 25th anniversary of the Department of Asian Affairs at the University of Missouri.

A Korean wrapping guilt is called a **bojagi**, which are typically square and can be made from a variety of materials, though silk or ramie are common. Bojagi have many uses, including as gift wrappings and weddings and in Buddhist rites. More recently, they have been recognized as a traditional art form, often featured in museums and inspiring modern reinterpretations. Traditional Korean folk religions believed that keeping something wrapped protects its good luck.

Additional Korean wrapping quilts will be on display at the Asian Affairs Center, 10 Memorial Union North, from October 1 to 15. The exhibit will then travel to the Harry S. Truman Library in Independence from October 20 to Dec. 31. The exhibits, called the Community Bojagi Project, is a partnership between the Saint Louis Art Museum and the Gateway Korea Foundation.

Hours for the exhibit at MU have not yet been set. Call 573-882-6902 for more information. *Beth Greimann, a BTQG member and an instructor at the Asian Culture Center, arranged for this special presentation to the guild chapters. Thank you Beth.*

Volunteers needed at monthly meetings to handle quilts

But, it's an easy way to participate in the guild; the presenters will appreciate your help; other members will appreciate your generosity of spirit; it will build your upper arm strength and restore your youthful physique. (There's no guarantee on that last pledge.)


