CEO's Message

You can rest assured knowing the Quilt Show is in good hands. She has begun recruiting and forming a committee to cover the various aspects of the endeavor. If you are interested in supporting her and the guild for the 2024 Quilt Show, please reach out to Martha to find out where your talents could best be used.

The retreat committee has been working hard to get things lined up for our annual retreat in February 2024. I hope many of you attend the retreat. It's simply 3 days of fun and friendship. I typically cut and kit up a few projects to take along. Retreat isn't just about the sewing, though. Forming friendships and gaining inspiration from one another makes it more than worth it.

For this month's thought, I want to talk about perspective. How many times have we put a quilt top together, stood back to admire, taken a photo to share, and then noticed a block was upside down? I can't tell you how many times that has happened to me and it's typically after I post or share the photo! We often change the perspective of our quilts. We take photos in greyscale to minimize the distraction of color and aid in balancing the shades. I want to encourage you to apply the concept of perspective to navigating relationships with others. Minimize the noise to evaluate the balance. Take a step back and evaluate the larger goal. Don't get so focused on one area that you lose sight of the desired outcome. The old saying is "put yourself in their shoes". *Continued on Page 4*
